7. Recognition of Visitors

Mr. Revoldt: Recognition of visitors.

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Debbie Goldthorpe: My name is Debbie Goldthorpe at 287 Orion, but also working at the YMCA. Over three years ago a committee of representatives from a variety of agencies and businesses in North Canton began meeting to discuss how to make North Canton a healthier community. I've spoke several times to this council at that point. The representatives are from the North Canton YMCA, Walsh University, Stark Parks, Mercy Medical Center, Aultman Health Foundation, North Canton Medical Foundation, North Canton City Schools, Achieve and several interested citizens in our community. Some – a few are with us tonight: Connie Rubin, from Stark Parks; Kathy Yaros, from the North Canton Y and Shawn Wise the Assistant Wellness Director at North Canton and Kathy does community and family. During the past three years we've been involved in the "Smoke Free Ohio" campaign, have run a yearly event spanning eight weeks designed to encourage wellness and health and have joined forces with Achieve of Stark County which has done a community assessment and a health survey. This past June, Shawn and I decided to see if the efforts of the Healthy Community Committee would qualify North Canton as a winner of the "Healthy Ohio Award". This award is presented by the State of Ohio to those cities which exemplify the state of living well. The awards recognize communities' outstanding achievements in implementing health related policies and providing health – the healthy community events and environments. The award recognizes the community's efforts in encouraging and enabling employees, residents and visitors to make healthy choices, including participating in physical activities, eating good and nutritious foods and avoiding tobacco. We filled out the application and two weeks ago Shawn made the trip to Cincinnati to receive the bronze award. There were eleven cities approximately our size that received either a gold, silver or bronze award. And we felt that the city should know about this award as we work on our fourth year and our projects for this next year. So I'd like you to see this and I'll start it over here and you can pass it on.

To wit there is a disagreement over what the specifications required in terms of the pounds per square inch on the PVC piping. Because we could not secure access to those specifications today, what I would like to ask the Members of Council to do by voice vote is to instruct its two representatives to the Board of Control to take no action until they receive direction from Council. So we'll have it, we just – Board of Control will just simply have two negative votes and there will be no action until this matter can be resolved. Now this dispute is more than a simple gentlemen's disagreement, it carries the risk of a temporary restraining order. So what we'd like to do is have the parties – give them an opportunity to discuss this matter tomorrow or through the week till we have something a little more definitive to bring to your consideration. Mr. Snyder: Mr. President, Members of Council, the reason we are doing this on an emergency is recommendation of bond counsel, Squires and Sanders, that we go out no later than November 1st for the anticipation of the issuance of the note. If it gets much beyond that period they begin to shut down for the season and we would lose the window for favorable financing and it could cost the city a little more money. And relative to that we can set it all up. We can borrow the money. We don't have to execute the note so if something comes up in the interim we're out nothing. So that's the story.

Mr. Zumbar: With your permission I'd like to have Bob Fisher come to the next council meeting to give his analysis of the RFP's (Requests for Proposals) that we received regarding health care and give you possibly a month to debate the health care proposals. We also have the Section 125 Health Care POP Plan re-adoption coming up as well. And a - possibly I should have the temporary budget here coming up for you folks for your review. We're working on the permanent budget and we're going through the budget requests that I received in my office and putting them into the overall permanent budget.

Mr. Revoldt: Do we have any executive sessions set for next Monday?
 Mrs. Kalpac: Nobody has said anything.

Mr. Revoldt: Okay, that's fine. We haven't put the agenda together. Is there any interest in meeting a little early so we can make sure we've got this at the front end - 6:45 to get started? Have Mr. Fisher...

Mr. Zumbar: Absolutely. I...

Mr. Snyder: Please, that the Committee and I, myself - we may get together and kind of review that prior to the submission. I'd appreciate that.

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Mayor Held: Yes, I have two things. The first is that if it's okay with council I would like to continue with the process as far as managing the budget, developing it. We – it worked very well last year. We had several budget meetings so that council members were fully apprised of the requests that we had. And it was a little bit longer process but I think in the long run it was a much healthier budget. And all the council members were informed to a very satisfactory level. So I'd like to continue with that same process. And secondly I have a – this is a nice announcement here. As all of council members know, we're trying to cross utilize the workers in the best way that we can. Cross utilizing our Service Department has worked out very well, particularly because we have Tom Chufar who's in charge of all of the Service Departments with the exception of the Water Treatment Plant that falls underneath Rich Steinhebel's supervision. But Park, Rec, Building Maintenance, Water Distribution, Street Department, Sanitation, they all fall underneath Tom Chufar with the assistance of two Operations Managers, Rich Rhodes and Brian Hill. We're able to cross utilize the workers in that way. In addition to that, because we are limited as far as the number of full time firefighters or firefighters that we have for daytime calls in the event that there is an emergency you have to have at a minimum four firefighters on each truck. If we do have a larger fire, we do now have – we have three individuals that are all firefighters, Rich Rhodes, who works as an Operations Manager, he's available for daytime fire calls if needed; Bobby Beadle, also works in the Service Department; we have Kathy Boresh that works in the Service Department during the day and if needed she's also a EMT; and then we just hired Ryan Lawrence who is a firefighter and also a chemist. We hired him at the Water Treatment Plan last week. So we're working hard to try to have service workers that can also be cross trained in the Fire Department just to give us that additional assistance when we need it and it's working out really well. That's all I have.

Mayor Held: Leaf Collection Program which is October 27th through December 4th. And you can pickup your leaf bags because you put – you have to put your yard waste in a leaf bag – a brown paper bag, not in a plastic bag. If it's in a plastic bag it's going to be thrown in the trash. If it's a brown paper bag, the large leaf bags, they'll pick it up at curbside same day – put it out the same day as your trash. You can pickup the leaf bags Monday through Friday from noon to 6, Saturday 8 to 1. There is is – what's that...

Mr. Wise: At the Civic Center.

Mayor Held: At the Civic Center. The program is really growing. Tom, the number of bags we usually give out, do you recall?
Mr. Chufar (speaking from audience): Inaudible...

Mayor Held: Okay, but it's going up. We've had – we keep having to buy more bags. And also they're only available to residents that are on the North Canton – City of North Canton waste hauling service. So apartment complexes and if you're not on North Canton's waste hauling service then you're not eligible to pickup the bags or recycling bins.

Mr. Foltz: That's – I'm glad you touched on that. I got my bags today. So thank you Mayor, I look forward to participating as always.

Mayor Held: Yes, thank you.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Peters.
Mr. Peters: No report.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. DeOrio.
Mr. DeOrio: No report.

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Mr. Revoldt: Mrs. Kiesling.
Mrs. Kiesling: No report.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Snyder.
Mr. Snyder: Nothing, sir.

Mr. Revoldt: A reminder - I'm reminded that Daylight Savings Time begins Sunday. So we'll pickup an extra hour.
Mrs. Kiesling: Fall back.

Mr. Revoldt: Yes. And that brings us to our final call for business. Is there anyone here who wishes to address the Council? Before we move to that, I was remiss last week because we have visitors many of whom this is their first time or have not been here recently. And I think it's important that some explanation of the rules of this body in terms of public speaks be made. The first is that those wishing to address the council be recognized by the Chair. And the second is that those who violate the decorum of this body, either by the use of confrontational or derogatory language, will find themselves ruled out of order and will be asked to return to their seat. And those the rules that apply to members around this table and apply to our visitors and guests. So with that Mr. Brenton, the microphone is yours.

They say the crews go on there because it belongs to North Canton and the one section of fence they took and stacked it up over another which is hanging in the sidewalk. I mentioned that before. And where they took a couple of those split rails out, that tree, the dead branch there you can see, the bark is falling off, it's hanging over the street. But they say, that wall and fence is yours. I don't know. Like ...inaudible... talked to him down there the other day. I just mentioned that to that woman and she said multiple times she called about that wall - nobody gives a shit. Now the poor people is stuck with \$3,000. So hooray for you guys. Hey anything else I'll look out for you. Thank you.
