RECOGNITION OF VISITORS:

7. Mr. Revoldt: Recognition of Visitors. Is there anyone here who wishes to address the Council this evening? Mr. Osborne.

Mr. Osborne: My name is Chuck Osborne, 307 Fairview Street, SE, North Canton, Ohio. I hope I can be less controversial tonight. A little laundry list of things that annoyed me as I travel around the City. Number one, the traffic signal at Hillside and West Maple. I was just talking to Mr. Benekos. I guess it's been discussed over the years. I don't know the origin of that light signal, if it's just for the schools, but it's ridiculous to drive down through there. I don't care what time of day or night – middle of the night, and have to stop. No other cars around – it just turns red. If it's there strictly for the schools, school is out – I don't know why it can't be changed to a different kind of cycle or just put it to flashing. Better yet, during the school year, outside of school hours, just turn it to flashing. It's a pain in the butt to drive around this City. There's a lot of annoyances. The light signal at McKinley – since you've closed off McKinley, there's really no reasoning to have those pedestrian activated light signals there. I set behind a line of cars the other day and watched a lady who was out for a stroll, crossing McKinley – no conflicting traffic, just because it was there, she pushed the button to turn it to red and not only were about 20 cars backed up going east from the light signal all the way to Maple, you couldn't even get off of Main Street because she had pushed the red light to cross an intersection there when there was no traffic going in and out of McKinley anyway. These kinds of little things, you know, housekeeping things, should be taken care of from time to time – re-evaluating some of these light signals. Also, it's been talked about for the last several years, is some regulations regulating our rental housing. I've talked to Mr. Snyder about it on two (2) or three (3) occasions over the last two (2) or three (3) years. Why is that language – these things don't cost money to fix but there are things you can do to make the City a little more family friendly, pedestrian friendly, driver friendly. In the big rush to put the Memorial up over there, I was upset to see, what I think, were healthy trees cut down, but if you look over on the McKinley side near Bitzer Park, there is a dead tree over there. It's dead all through the top and it's just waiting to fall off and hit somebody and I brought that to Mr. Davies' attention. I presume he's passed it on to the City. Somebody should be over there in the next forty-eight (48) hours taking that out. They were so concerned about dead trees over in Bitzer Park but they didn't care to turn around and look at the McKinley side of the park. That's all I have. Thank you.

Mr. Revoldt: Thank you, Mr. Osborne. Mr. Dansizen.

Mr. Dansizen: Jim Dansizen, 502 South Main Street, North Canton, Ohio. Mr. Osborne's reference to the tree that was cut down because of the Memorial is not true. That tree was dead and the Memorial had absolutely nothing to do with it. The placement of the Memorial was not even close to where that tree is – or was. Thank you, Mr. President.

Mr. Revoldt: Thank you, Mr. Dansizen.

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Mr. Osborne: (from audience) There were two (2) trees.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Breckenridge.

Mr. Breckenridge: Thank you. I'm Larry Breckenridge, 1300 Pleasantview Avenue, SE, North Canton. I'm here this evening on behalf of the Citizens Survey Committee to number 1, give the Council and Administration members a quick brief update of the status. We are in the very beginning of talking about the topics, the design, if you will, of the second survey for the citizens of North Canton. Our tentative plan right now is that we would like to see that go out with the water bills in the November timeframe. We do know the, based upon what happened with the first survey, the steps that have to be taken, and we will follow all of those as we did in the first survey, including early previews to Council and Administration; obviously, our Director of Law and back to the Finance Department, in time to be included in that mailing. The second thing that we would like to do is to tell you that our next committee meeting will be next Wednesday evening at 6:00 o'clock in the Mack Room down at Price Park. It will be a short meeting because we do want to end it in time for that start at 7:00 o'clock of the concert in Price Park, and everybody in our committee intends on attending that. So if anybody in this room here would like to sit in, please, take the opportunity to do that, and third, and not least, we would solicit again, from Council and the Administration, any comments that you have regarding topics and/or questions to be included in that next survey. Like I said, we are in the design stages of that – putting it together. So if there are topics that Council and Administration would like to see included, please bring that back to our attention. Thank you, everyone.

Mr. Revoldt: Is there anyone else who wishes to address the Council?

Mr. Brenton: You have to walk like that when you have a plate in your knee, you know. But anyhow, Sam Brenton, 1681 Westfield, SW. I didn't finish my story the last time when I called you, I also said when I shut the mower off and trapped that guy, I did what – I gave him a big applause, didn't I. Now, when they was putting that bridge in down there at Everhard and South Main, they trimmed the trees and I told them then, they did not trim enough. Right now, it's a blind corner. You can see half a mile or more that way – you can't see twenty (20) feet that way and when those trees, whoever told you guys at the night thing to plant those trees, in another five (5) years, you go down Salway and Everhard and look at that corner, those big evergreens there, you're going to have the same thing. So, what you ought to do is find somebody that knows what the hell they're doing, ODT Safety, and have them check that corner out. But anyhow, about a week ago I got one of the best thank you's that I ever got. A gate was stuck at Everhard Road and those train tracks. Even the buses were going across, so I called 911 – she says who do you want, police, fire, what? I said I'm going to let you figure it out. I explained the gates were down and they're going around it. She said I'll give you someone to talk to. She hooked me up with a person and she said "thank you very much because that is dangerous doing that". I am very very safety minded, I don't care who you are or where you're at, when I see something before it happens, I'll let you know; and that woman on 911 gave me the best thank you. But, that corner down there is a blind corner, should've been taken care of years ago. That's the way I go when I go downtown. Anyhow, I'll see you guys in another two (2) weeks.

Ordinance No. 46-10 – 2nd Reading – Water, Sewer & Rubbish Committee

An ordinance amending Chapter 927.07 RATES of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton for the purpose of increasing the user rates for sewer users of the sanitary sewer system of the City of North Canton, repealing any and all legislation inconsistent herewith and declaring the same to be an emergency.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Davies.

Mr. Davies: Pursuant to the proposal issued by Arcadis on our, we had two (2), one (1) on water, one (1) on sewer, we need to raise the rates, primarily because of the fact that Canton is raising rates to us. We are going to do some sort of metering of the material going through the sewer to determine how much goes into the Canton plant and we also are – Canton has to upgrade their plant – it's a 72 million dollar upgrade, to take out phosphorous and so forth, which we have been asked, we haven't been asked, we have to participate in – we have to pay our fair share. So we need to raise rates. We were looking at raising rates in each of the next four (4) years but what we decided is to raise rates for essentially the next year and a half to see where we are and to see what's going to happen with the monitoring and so forth and then determine where and how much more we have to go. Canton is also re-looking at the proposed upgrade of the plant. It may come in less than what they determined and so forth, so we didn't want to raise it the full amount that Arcadis recommended because some of the costs may be less than were anticipated. So we're raising it for the balance of this year and then 2011 and then we'll look at it from there. Any questions from the Committee? Council? Administration? Mr. Benekos, anybody? Then I would move that we adopt.

Ordinance No. 48-10 – 1st Reading – Finance & Property Committee

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton to apply for, accept and utilize a grant through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security – Federal Emergency Management Agency in an amount not to exceed \$90,000 for the purchase and installation of exhaust systems for Fire Stations #1 and #2 for use by the North Canton Fire Department and declaring the same to be an emergency.

Mr. Snyder: Mr. President and Members of Council, this is a mechanism for the Mayor to apply for the grant. As it so states, the purpose is to put in exhaust systems for the diesel fumes that collect in the building and that's about it.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Snyder, may I ask the Chief a question?

Mr. Snyder: Certainly.

Mr. Revoldt: Chief Bacon, obviously the specifications for this project are on hand. Once we accept the grant, what – when do you anticipate the start of the project and completion?

Mr. Bacon: (Speaking from the audience) The soonest we start, I would say...

Mr. Kelly: Month to three (3) weeks

Mr. Bacon: ...the next three (3) weeks.

Mr. Revoldt: Okay.

Mr. Bacon: ...and depending when the equipment comes in as to when they'll be finished – in a very short time.

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Mr. Revoldt: Okay.

Mr. Kelly: (Inaudible) from audience

Mr. Bacon: Probably about two (2) or three (3) days to put it up and it will be complete.

Mr. Revoldt: And then I would assume that we will be reporting at some juncture to the Department of Homeland Security regarding that expenditure?

Ordinance No. 49-10 – 1st Reading – Finance & Property Committee

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Finance of the City of North Canton to make appropriations and transfers of funds in the 2010 appropriations to provide for necessary expenses and adjustments; and declaring the same to be an emergency.

Mr. Snyder: Mr. President and Members of Council, we had the request from Administration that they have additional funds for clerical support in their office on a part-time basis, a temporary employee, who under the part-time appropriation budget, this money is being transferred from another pre-appropriated fund. I believe the amount, the original request was for Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000). The amount has been pared down, seeing there is only half a year, to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) and that's what the (inaudible) amount would be from a pre-approved appropriation – it would be a transfer to salaries to part-time administrative help. Any questions, I'll try to answer.

Mr. Davies: Have we decided what we're paying per hour and how many hours, and so forth?

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Mr. Wise: The temporary staffing agency will charge us Fourteen Dollars (\$14) an hour.

Mr. Davies: Oh, you're going through an agency – okay, because they pay (inaudible) and all that stuff.

Mr. DeOrio: Is this being done on an emergency?

Mr. Snyder: There is an emergency clause in it. I don't know - it can be done with more than one (1) reading if it's the request of the Council.

Mr. Revoldt: I think that might be prudent.

Mr. Snyder: Alright then, at that point, we will have additional readings on it.

Ordinance No. 50-10 – 1st Reading – Water, Sewer & Rubbish Committee

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton, through the Board of Control, to enter into an amended Canton-North Canton Sewer Agreement Supplement ("Agreement") by and between the City of North Canton ("North Canton") and the City of Canton ("Canton") for Phosphorus / Total Nitrogen and Miscellaneous Improvements Project to the Canton Water Reclamation Facility and declaring the same to be an emergency.

Mr. Davies: This is kind of what I had alluded to before. This is an agreement that we're entering into for the design phase, our portion of the design phase of the improvements to Canton's sewer treatment plant. The total cost, I think is 2.5 million and our cost or our portion is 7.5% of that, which if someone can do the math quick, they can tell me what that is – I think \$140,000 or something like that – so that's our portion of the design phase. They decided to do it that way – break the design out ahead of the total cost. So I would – let me ask, any questions of the Committee, Council, Administration, any comments? So I would move that we approve.

Mr. Revoldt: Reports, Director of Law.

Mr. Revoldt: Excuse me, I'll get that under New Business.

Mr. Wise: Thank you.

Mr. Revoldt: Director of Finance.

Mr. Zumbar: Yes, sir – two (2) items. I presented to the Clerk today the projected expenditures for all the funds, the projected balances – you should receive that this week in your packet, probably tomorrow. The second item is per Council's direction, in regards to the Water-Utility and Sewer-Utility bill, work was done in terms of re-programming the bill to break out the North Canton Sewer portion, the portion for the County and the portion for Canton. So that will appear on the bill just to give folks a heads up. It will occur with probably the time when Council adopts the ordinance and we'll make it effective on the next billing.

Mr. Revoldt: Very good.

Mr. Zumbar: That concludes my report, Mr. President.

Mr. Revoldt: Director of Administration.

Mr. Wise: Yes, the Mayor who is not here this evening, today was involved in a community covenant signing with the US Army Reserve Center up on Highland Park, just north of the City. He's at the second phase of that ceremony today which is a flag retirement ceremony. He was hoping to be here by 7:30, quarter to eight, but obviously, he was unable to attend this evening. It was a very nice event. We had a number of officials present. There was a signing of a covenant supporting the community, a wider community other than just North Canton. Some Stark County Commissioners were there, a signing of a covenant to support the armed forces and also support and provide efforts for those family members, the service members who are serving currently in theaters of war. Thank you.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Bowles.

Mr. Bowles: I passed out a couple of sheets there – once again North Canton City Schools was ranked in the top 6% in the nation – about 1600 schools and this is the second year in a row, I believe, and it's another great marketing opportunity for the City of North Canton and we'll make sure that's on the City's website. We have a lot of things to applaud in this community – our safety, our safety forces and our school district and our location, so it's a real compliment to the community and the school district. So I wanted to make sure everyone was aware of that. I'm not sure if that's something that gets in the local news media. End of report.

Mr. Revoldt: Clerk.

Mrs. Kalpac: No report.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Foltz.

Mr. Foltz: No reports.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Peters.

Mr. Peters: Yes, one question, Jim, did we get alternative appraisals for the sidewalk, yet?

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Mr. Benekos: We have appraisal prices but we have not re-bid it – done a formal bidding on that. It will be over \$25,000. We have talked with a couple contractors informally on that. If it was under \$25,000, then we'd be able to not have to bid it but we were not able to get prices under \$25,000.

Mr. Peters: When will that be?

Mr. Benekos: Right now it's not a high priority item. We've got a couple million dollar projects out there that are on Main Street and East Maple. They're using up the majority of our time so I can't say when we'll have that.

Mr. Peters: That's it, Daryl.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. Davies.

Mr. Davies: I do have a report. This past Sunday – or – many people may or may not know – Council gave to the Canton Art Museum a grant of, I believe it was \$2,500, came out of the grant we got from our recycling grant which was \$60,000, we gave them \$2,500. They do programs with area schools and children. They take, generally, recycled materials, cut them into geometric patterns and then make things with them and they were part of the Art Fest that went on at Fieldcrest this past Sunday and as Councilman of that Ward, I was asked to come and I stopped by and, you know, when this all came up, I approved it, I mean, it's fine, you know but I wasn't really all that – neatest thing I ever saw. I had more fun. There were kids there.

The kids loved it. They enjoyed putting these things together. We took different shapes and made different things. We had a huge soccer ball this big – the kids could get in and so forth. They painted. The kids sat and painted these things for, you know, several hours. It really is a wonderful program. There were a number of people there doing the art things and so forth that were teachers that were watching and said, well how can we get into this? I'd like to do this in my classroom because it was a wonderful way to teach geometry and so forth. So, I'm glad we did it because it really is a great program. I had a great time. It was fun being with the kids. So, hopefully we can find money in the future to keep supporting this. It's a wonderful endeavor. That's it.

Mr. Revoldt: Mr. DeOrio.

Mr. DeOrio: I'd like to just expend on the Economic Development Director's comments and applaud our safety forces. I was driving around here in the last few days or so with family in tow and had an educational moment to talk to them about issues of getting older – one's getting into that 7th grade and everything; and ahead of us was one of our finest in the car, a police officer, and I noticed an unusual gathering of youth in the 900 block of North Main, and I told my kids, I said, watch, I'll bet our police officers, they're going to check out what's going on because it just didn't seem normal, and drove past and turned around up there by that barber shop and came back down and found out what was going on. That's a great thing to have that someone would care enough to do that because I'm sure in other communities they would just drive by, so I wanted to applaud them in their efforts. It was great.

Mr. Revoldt: Mrs. Kiesling.

Mr. Revoldt: Before we conclude this evening, it's always good to have some good news. I'm pleased to report that our Fire Department elected to rebuild Engine #3, a 1989 Pierce, replaced was the water tank and the water pump. The total cost of that repair was approximately \$30,000 and it's estimated that the service life on this 1989 Pierce piece of equipment will be another ten (10) to fifteen (15) years. The new replacement cost was \$400,000. So, Chief, please extend our thanks to your colleagues. This is the kind of action Council seeks. In addition, Mr. Zumbar has indicated that as a result of adjustments in our collective bargaining, that in the period between May 12 and June 12, we've saved approximately \$7,000 – one (1) month for EMS overtime. Police overtime is estimated right now at approximately \$30,000 here today, so the first five (5) months, and again about \$6,000 per month, and dispatch, we believe saved approximately \$6,000 as well. So, through agreement between labor and management, we are achieving some savings in starting to move those costs in a positive direction. So, final call for business, is there anyone who wishes to address Council? Seeing none, I apologize, we're going to send everybody home before 8:00 o'clock. I'll entertain a motion to adjourn.
