Mr. Snyder: Thank you. At this time we have a special presentation. His Honor the Mayor David Held has asked for some time prior to the meeting to make that presentation. Mr. Mayor.

Mayor Held: First off, I would like to thank our girls State Championship softball team for being here today. This is really a special time right now because it's not often that we're able to welcome a State Championship team. We have done it in the past, but it's not very often and we're very proud of you girls. We're very proud of the parents and the coaches because we know it really is a team effort to bring you young ladies to where you are State Champions. So what we've done is we have put together a proclamation and it has your individual name on it and it also has the team picture, and this team picture was taken at the rally because what we did, the Council members, we invited the girls to ride into town and we gave them a police and a fire-truck escort, and so we were blasting the horns and the sirens down there starting at Fazoli's and then we went right on up to the high school and where we had a rally and then this team also had an opportunity to climb on the back of our ladder truck to get their picture taken because we learned from the first time we weren't so comfortable when the last State Championship softball team rode in on the ladder truck. We thought, boy, this is pretty high and there is a lot of traffic lights and stuff that we're getting pretty close so we decided to change that plan but we still allowed the ladies to get up there and get their picture taken. And so, again, we are very proud of you and I think it's really what makes North Canton such a special community is the people that are in it and I think that you young ladies really represent what North Canton is all about, which is good people that are hard working, dedicated and committed, and we are very, very proud of you. So with that in mind I would like to read a proclamation. And, again, this is individualized for each one of you young ladies and they are in alphabetical order. We learned the first time in passing these out, we like to keep it simple. Whereas: I, David J. Held, as Mayor of the City of North Canton, Ohio, hereby honor MacKenzie DiPietro for her contribution to the 2011 Hoover Vikings Girls State Championship Softball Team. Whereas, on June 4, 2011, due to their dedication, hard work, energy and exceptional efforts, the 2011 North Canton Hoover High School Girls Softball team achieved their long time goal of becoming Ohio Division I State Champions in softball; and, Whereas, with a thirty win - three loss season Hoover earned their State Championship Title by defeating defending state champion Massillon Perry, 4-2 in the district finals; Eastlake North, 7-2 in regional semifinal; Youngstown Boardman, 3-0 in the regional final; Elyria, 9-5 in the, State Championship semi-finals; and, Whereas, in the State Championship finals against Gahanna Lincoln, the Vikings were too fast, too explosive on offense, and too tenacious on defense. The team claimed the District I State Championship Title with a 4-2 win; and, Whereas, a 26 year veteran softball coach (Jerry Goodpasture) has the energy, devotion, dedication and high expectation and respect from his players to maintain a disciplined, fundamental course of mental preparedness for the 30-3 season noting that "Winning the regional championship never gets old;" and, Whereas, the sponsors, fundraising efforts, and support from our community has afforded these student athletes the opportunity to be members of this team and maintain focus on values, conduct and character while representing our community; and, Whereas, May this commemoration provide an opportunity for all citizens of our community to pay tribute to the dedication, hard work, and success of the players and coaches of the 2011 North Canton Hoover High School Girls Softball Team; and, NOW, THEREFORE, I, David J. probably quite as good as what I would like certainly, cause I certainly like to have it taken care of, and rather than calling me or dropping me a note I just get summoned to the Court. So I am a little bit disappointed. I think things need to be done a little bit differently. I know North Canton in years past would have done that. For it to happen this way now is just not acceptable. So, that's basically what I have to say.

Mr. Snyder: Mr. McGeorge, may I ask a question? Was the lease holder informed of the violation? I'm sure there was an ordinance relative to some type of ...

Mr. McGeorge: It was an ordinance; I think the man had some, I don't know, trash. I don't know what all he had out there.

Mr. Snyder: Was he informed and certified that it was...

Mr. McGeorge: He probably was informed. I was never informed but like I say, it could have been handled with a call. I have invested in a lot of properties here. I fix properties up. I buy them and fix them, rent them, sell them, whatever. I have lived here or close to here all my life so it's sad to me. And the other thing that is upsetting too is you come up you start talking to people and everybody says that's not my job. I think that's what's wrong with our community. That's what's wrong with Stark County, Ohio and the Country cause people step back and say that's not their job. If people would go just the extra mile, I think they could make a lot of things happen. I'm sure that if Coach Goodpasture hadn't have been lucky enough and good enough and worked hard enough to win the State Title this year, he would have probably come up and said it was his fault; the buck stops at his desk. But I don't find that when I come to City Hall. And I would really love to see that in the future. I would love to see that type of thing happen.

Mr. Snyder: I appreciate your comments. Thank you. Anyone else wishing to speak before Council?

Mrs. Baughman: Miriam Baughman, 320 Weber Avenue. I'd like to make a comment about the proposed tree ordinance. I did some research this past week. I called my Allstate insurance agent who conferred with the Allstate claims person and what I found out is that if I hire somebody to come onto my property to do work and there is an injury or a death, I am not liable. The person doing the work or the folks that work for that person are liable. If somebody is cutting one of my trees down and the tree falls on my house, then what I do is I put the claim in to Allstate, pay the deductible, which for me is \$250. They then go after the person doing the work. If they are fully insured I get my deductible back. If they are not insured or don't have enough to cover the damage, my Allstate will pay it. So I am not out anything. Now I guess the question is for the lawyer, are there any cases in Ohio that maybe went to the Supreme Court and had a surprise? That they were indeed liable, the homeowner?

Mr. Nilges. Anything is possible.

Mrs. Baughman: Is there any case history?

Mr. Nilges: Not that I am aware of.

Mrs. Baughman: Okay. So in other words, if you hire somebody to come on your property you really are not in any jeopardy if you have homeowner's insurance, which I'm sure everybody does. And I like my ward councilman's idea to put the warning on the water bill to have people make sure they have insurance but I guess in the long run if they don't have insurance it doesn't matter anyway, as long as you have homeowner's. Okay, thank you.

Mr. Grimes: Just to be a little more patient with us. I know today the weather was good and they were out fixing more potholes and stuff today. I noticed them in my neighborhood so my neighbors might let me up a little bit (laughter) but they are out there getting to it when they can so. The other thing we got going is to remember that next month there is a rate increase on our garbage. That's when the contract kicks in for an extra dollar, and a few weeks ago we had somebody come up complaining about the damaged trees in Dogwood Park. The ground was finally good enough and we were able to get in there and cut those trees down so we're still looking at Dogwood Park to see how we can make some other improvements but we wanted to get the trees out because of a safety problem there. And there is a pool study going on. We want to take a look at how our swimming pool could be better, what changes we have to make, and there will be some public input on that but if anybody does have any concerns or they come to you or the public themselves, they can write me, call me or email me because we are trying to make a list because obviously, you know, people that use the pool everyday probably have the good ideas on what they would like, so, thank you, sir.

Mr. Snyder: Mr. Mayor.

Mayor Held: Yes, two announcements. First, we do have a Sergeant's position, another Sergeant's position that we are in the process of filling, and we fill that internally as we have had retirements of the Lieutenants. And again, we are filling the Lieutenants' positions with Sergeants. It saves the City about 9% in overall cost and we have just appointed two Sergeants already and we have a third that we are in the process of filling and that should be announced sometime in the next two weeks. And then also, we do have two patrolmen positions that we are filling. They are not new positions. We are not adding. We are just filling the vacancies because as people move up the ladder through retirements then we have to fill those positions so in the next couple of months we will look at filling those positions. And then also, as far as the nuisances, I know Eric has been working very hard over in the permits department with Hans and our Assistant Law Director to handle those issues. I think we have done a really good job keeping up with them

especially considering all the rain that we've had here in the City. It seems like a lot of things, a lot of the problems that we have in the City are very cyclical and one of those is high grass but I think that the City has done a pretty good job of keeping up with that. And that's all I have.

Mr. Snyder: Mr. Engineer.

Mr. Benekos: Yes. I'm checking the weather to see if they are going to be painting tonight. (Laughter) They have Main Street from the Square north paved. They put the final coat on that this weekend. They are planning to do one lane south of the Square tonight and then on through the week weather permitting. I think they have done a great job there. It should be ready for the race. They will not adjust the manholes before the race. There will be a little hole that we'll fill that with asphalt prior to the race so nobody turns their ankle or anything. But it will be ready for that. So, are there are any other questions regarding the Main Street Project?

Mr. DeOrio: Yes. I noticed on the east side of the street north of Maple.  
Mr. Benekos: Correct.

Mr. DeOrio: I think one spot is like right by that church that's just past the Hoover plant, that in the area of the cement gutter

Mr. Benekos: Correct.

Mr. DeOrio: that there are stretches of asphalt in that.  
Mr. Benekos: Yes.

Mr. DeOrio: What's the story there?

Mr. Benekos: It's a rubberized asphalt mix. That will heal over time with the heat and with traffic wear on that.

Mr. DeOrio: I mean, why wasn't that part of the curb done in cement, the gutter part?

Mr. Benekos: Oh, the gutter part. Okay. I know what you're saying.

Mr. DeOrio: As opposed to that.

Mr. Benekos: That's temporary.  
Mr. DeOrio: Okay.

Mr. Benekos: When they ran the skids they ran them electronically so it did take into account the gutter. They ran it so the lane was smooth and consistent. So they used electronics and they put a better product down however it didn't take into account the curb elevation, or the gutter elevations. What they will do is they will come back and they will replace the gutter. They'll take that, it's temporary so they can drive on it because there was too much of a lip there. If a tire got caught there it would cause a problem so they put some temporary asphalt in but they will come back and they will take that asphalt out and they will cut out that section of concrete and raise that.

Mr. DeOrio: Very good.

Mr. Benekos: On the west side, when they came down on the curb lane, they did not run with the electronics. They ran it based on the curb so if you're really sensitive in your car you'll feel little undulations there when they open that up but it's not a major thing but that's the reason. Very observant of you.

Mr. DeOrio: Thank you.

Mr. Snyder: After this is completed we're going to begin south of the bridge. I see they are working down there now.

Mr. Benekos: Correct. They're doing the concrete work down there, the curbs and the catch basins. And yea, when they are done here they will go down there. But yea, they were concentrating here to get done for the 4<sup>th</sup>.


