Mr. Fox: Thank you, Mr. President. As Council is aware there have been a few complaints from some of those that speak at our Recognition of Visitors' times. Some of the complaints have been that they have not received fair allocation of time in comparison to some other speakers. So. I just want to go over a little refresher of the Rules of Council for those that do attend regularly, and just information for those of you that's the first time that you're here for one of our council Meetings. According to our Rules of Council, Chapter 115, citizens are permitted to speak only during the Recognition of Visitors portion of the meetings following this announcement. For each of the visitors, each speaker is requested to identify themselves by their name, address, and the subject matter that they intend to speak about. Speakers will direct their comments to the Presiding Officer, which is President of Council Snyder, and are limited to a maximum of five minutes or at the discretion of the Presiding Officer, the speaker may continue beyond the limit if their remarks are deemed germane, non-redundant and consistent with the rules of decorum. When a speaker speaks for the first time this evening we'll have a small timer on the corner of the screen so the speaker and each visitor can see the amount of time allocated to each speaker. Once the five minutes are up, we ask simply that you pause, the President will make the determination if the remarks are germane, non-redundant. and consistent with the rules of decorum. If they are, you will be permitted to speak for a reasonable additional period of time. If not, we simply ask that you take your seat and respect the other speakers. Also, the speakers are required to observe all the rules of decorum as prescribed in Robert's Rules of Order, meaning that there's no debate, disrespect, or personal attacks. Also for the podium, we have had some complaints as well as far as sound quality. Our Clerk has painstakingly looked and found what we believe is the proper spot for the podium for the best in sound quality and for the speaker to address the Presiding Officer. So we ask that you not move the podium. If you need to raise it up or down for your notes, please ask the Clerk and she'll be glad to assist you with that. Nothing else? Thank you.

I've also asked about, I believe it's called easements and the width of those easements on property that have been, I don't know, granted to furnish another homeowner access to a sewer line from one street, which is specifically Woodside Avenue NE, to Wise, which is Wise NE also, and it goes all the way through private property. Since then the house that was at 423 Woodside has been razed. There is a garage there, along with the driveway, that and has been added to since the house was razed to allow to park a boat and things on this property. I understand under the ordinance concerning this, that in two years if there's not a house built, then this structure must be taken down. Well this is exactly the property that this easement runs through. And it's questionable whether in fact if it would be a buildable lot with this easement access on this property. And I've really asked, what's the width? And I haven't been able to get an answer. I've had some other problems, but if we could - someone could address these or somehow, like I said, an Act of Congress, but in this case an Act of Council to help me out on this, I'd greatly appreciate it. That's the piece that's contiguous to the Postiy property. Mrs. Kiesling: I kept reading that thinking didn't we just go backwards. Mr. Snyder: I forget her name. That's that lady that has that small ¾ of an acre parcel right there next to the trailer park. Mrs. Kiesling: So, do we need to reread it or just amend it next week? Mr. Griffith: We're going to just amend it next week. Mr. Snyder: Where's the - is the ordinance in the,,,, Mrs. Kiesling: The ordinance reads that way as well. And, that's what I was looking at. Mr. Snyder: The next time that it goes through, it has to, you'll have to... Mrs. Kiesling: Amend it... Mr. Snyder: Amend it. At the next reading, yeah. Mr. Fox: At the third reading. Mrs. Kiesling: Because we just went in a full circle. Mr. Snyder: At the next reading... Mr. Fox: Yes, the third reading. Mr. Snyder. The third reading. The next reading – the second reading will be scheduled on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Mrs. Kiesling: I don't think I noticed it the last time. Mr. Snyder: And we can amend it at that time. Mrs. Kiesling: Oh, no, this was just the first reading. Mr. Snyder: This was the first reading Mrs. Kiesling: Right. That's why I'm like... Mr. Snyder: It takes three readings. The second reading, we'll correct it. Mrs. Kiesling: Okay. Alright. I think we're going to go to GBA. Mr. Snyder: I appreciate your diligence in noting this. Mr. Cerreta: You are awake over here. Mr. Foltz: We don't want any more public neighborhood meetings do we? Mrs. Kiesling: I'm like wait a minute, isn't this a circle. Mr. Foltz: I think we had a great compromise and we don't want to take a step backwards. Mr. Snyder: We don't want to blow it up. We'll change it. Mrs. Kiesling: Okay.

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Mr. Snyder: Thank you for that though.

Mrs. Kiesling: Oh, no problem.

Mr. Snyder: Now, Director of Law.

Mr. Fox: Yeah, I believe it's correct here. I think in transferring it from one to the other...

Mrs. Kiesling: Oh yeah, I know.

Mr. Fox: This past week, working closely again with Finance on outstanding income tax issues, failure to files. Some of the larger ones have been turned over kind of quickly with just a little bit of reaching out to them. One was a \$7,000 payment. Another one a \$1,000 payment. So, those are coming along really well. As well as we know that the graffiti ordinance is going to come into play in the next couple of days. I've been working with the Director of Administrative Services. He's working on, you know, the polite, courteous approach in trying to help some of those that we know that some of the graffiti is placed on brick, it's really porous, difficult to remove, and so we've reached out to try to help them to do that. So hopefully the first couple of ones that we face it won't be in anyway punitive, but more reaching out to help them to clear it off and showing them some things that we learned with Eric and some other Council members when we removed it from the dance studio. So hopefully we'll be able to get those and turn those around and clear off some of the graffiti without the - like I said some of the punitive measures.

Mr. Snyder: It's good to see you justifying your income over there.

Mr. Fox: Sure.

But we've got some flushing going on out there. If you haven't seen it yet, we did complete the salt sheds that you approved earlier this year in the budget. Thanks to the City Engineer getting on some folks because we definitely wanted that finished before winter. But it will be a lot nicer for us. It will hold more salt. And of course our other one was a safety concern of mine. So we got that taken care of. Also Administration met with the Stark Regional Planning Commission Member and Commissioner Pete Ferguson this week. Just to let them know, they have a study going on about collaboration of building departments and that and just to let them know that we'll cooperate fully with them, whatever information they need. So we want to be a part of that study too just to see how that comes out. So thank you, Mr. President.

Mr. Snyder: Thank you, sir. Mr. Mayor

Mayor Held: Yes, We have the annual Community Christmas Sing on December 2nd. And this will begin at 4:30 and it will go until 6:30. At 4:30 to 5:00, we'll have the Elite Silver Stars Holiday Performance on East Maple. At 5:05 to 5:20, we'll have the Hoover High Notes performance.
