BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to enter into a Contract and MOU by and between the Sub-grantee and the Lead Agency to join and be a participating member of the Stark County OVI (Operating of a Vehicle while Intoxicated) Task Force.

Section 2. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and further necessary for the timely implementation of the OVI Contract and MOU and to ensure the continued efficient operation of the Police Department; wherefore, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor.

OVI COUNTYWIDE TASK FORCE CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into as of this 15th day of February, by and between: the University of Akron Research Foundation, doing business as the Center for Transportation Safety & Innovation, Akron, Ohio (hereinafter referred to as the "Lead Agency") and North Canton Police Department (hereinafter referred to as the "sub-grantee"), WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency has received a Stark County OVI Task Force grant from the Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Ohio Traffic Safety Office (OTSO) and is desirous of engaging the contract agency to provide targeted enforcement activity in completion of the aforementioned grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

I. SERVICE RENDERED BY SUBGRANTEE

Targeted enforcement by sworn law enforcement officers done at approved problem sites determined by the Task Force "problem ID process." Targeted enforcement will be conducted in support of the Stark County OVI Task Force goals, as well as the use of low manpower OVI checkpoints to conduct low-cost highly effective OVI checkpoints throughout Stark County, and zero tolerance enforcement of safety belt and child safety seat laws during enforcement efforts in targeted communities. The Task Force's goals are to decrease the incidence of OVI violations, reduce the number of traffic-related fatal crashes, reduce the number of alcohol-related fatal crashes, and increase seat belt usage. In addition the sub-grantee shall comply with the following:

- a. Law Enforcement Reports: The sub-grantee will report enforcement activity to the Lead Agency on a monthly basis. Monthly reporting must be submitted by the 5th calendar day of the following month to the Lead Agency and reports should be submitted regardless of whether the sub-grantee conducted any grant-related activity in the preceding month. Justification for sites selected for enforcement activity should be documented and maintained as a part of the sub-grantee's file for this agreement.
- b. Training Certification: The sub-grantee will assure that all enforcement personnel to be involved in approved enforcement-related activity will be certified in the following type(s) of training as appropriate:
 - i. Standard Field Sobriety Testing (SFST),
 - ii. NHTSA Alcohol Detection Apprehension Prosecution (ADAP),
 - iii. Electronic Speed Measuring Device Training (ESMD), and

III. DELIVERY OF SERVICES

The sub-grantee will complete all work no later than September 30, 2012.

IV. SUBCONTRACTORS

The sub-grantee is responsible for all work it leads and undertakes related to this grant and will not hold the Lead Agency responsible for its actions or failure to act.

The sub-grantee shall not subcontract, in whole or in part, with any other firm, partnership, corporation, or entity to perform the services to be done on the OVI Task Force without prior approval from the Lead Agency.

The sub-grantee warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person other than a bona fide employee working solely for the sub-grantee to solicit or secure this agreement and has not paid or has not agreed to pay any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee in violation hereof.

V. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS

Sub-grantee shall maintain all records pertaining to this agreement for a minimum of three years, pursuant to the requirements of the OTSO/Ohio Department of Public Safety. This agreement provides the right of any authorized representative of the federal or state government to audit and inspect any and/or all project-related records at all reasonable normal working hours during the contract period and for a period of three years after the completion of this contract.

The sub-grantee shall maintain worker's compensation and proof of liability insurance for its employees and autos operated by them for and during their employment. Certification of Insurance will provided to the Lead Agency before the start of this agreement, if requested.

VI. CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, INELIGIBILITY AND VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION-LOWER TIER COVERED TRANSACTION

The sub-grantee certifies that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency. Where the sub-grantee is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, the sub-grantee shall attach an explanation to this agreement.

VII. ASSURANCE REGARDING PARENT CONTRACT

The provisions of the agreement include all of the conditions and assurances of the parent agreement FFY 2012 GRANT # OVITF-2012-77-00-00-00897-00, dated February 15, 2012 between the Ohio Department of Public Safety

State of Ohio Traffic Safety Office Provisions for Sub-Grantee

The following are provisions that shall be used by the sub-grantee when entering into an agreement (contract) when funds administered by the Ohio Traffic Safety Office (OTSO) that total \$5,000 or more are used. This provision includes requirements of both the federal and state government.

Note: For clarification purposes the word contractor is the agency, vendor, individual, etc., that the sub-grantee is contracting with for the desired scope of service.

PROVISION 1 Security Agreement Disclaimer

The sub-grantee warrants that he has not employed or retained any company or person other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Consultant to solicit or secure this agreement, and that he has not paid or has not agreed to pay any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, or other considerations contingent upon or resulting from the awarding or making of this agreement.

For breach or violation of this warrant, the State, in conjunction with the sub-grantee, shall have the right to annul this agreement without liability, or in its discretion, to deduct from the agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or contingent fee.

Either party may terminate this agreement by giving the other party written advance notice of its election to do so. If the contract is canceled under this provision, the sub-grantee shall reimburse the Contractor for all work completed and in progress to that date. Upon termination and final payment, all design materials, artwork any other items/products developed by the Contractor shall become the property of the sub-grantee.

PROVISION 2 Reporting Requirements

Performance reports will be required to be submitted by the contractor as frequently as required by the sub-grantee. Performance reports shall include brief information on (1) a comparison of actual accomplishments to the objectives established for the period and can include a computation of the cost per unit of output (2) the reasons for slippage if established objectives were not met (3) additional pertinent information including analysis and explanation of cost overruns or high unit cost.

Personnel activity reports may be required for any individual working on this federal grant program. These reports, at a minimum, must document

materials will increase the cost of the overall project contract by more than 25 percent. Clear justification for the purchase of non-domestic items must be in the form of a waiver request submitted to and approved by the Secretary of Transportation.

PROVISION 7 Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion -- Lower Tier Covered Transactions:

The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency.

Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.

PROVISION 8 Limitations

This agreement is a commitment to perform the work identified herein and this authorization is limited to:

- a) The scope of work performed after the "Authorized to Proceed" and before the "Agreement Termination" dates, as specified in the transmittal letter;
- b) The scope of work, rates of participations, federal funds, special conditions, and cost category amounts as defined by the Project Plan, Budget, Addendum (as appropriate), and other attachments;
- c) Actual costs that are incurred in accordance with OMB Circulars A-87, A-21, A-122, 45 CFR Part 74 Appendix E limited to the approved activity.

This agreement is to be funded under the federal grant program that begins October 1, 2011. Funding of this agreement is dependent upon the availability of federal funds as appropriated and obligated by the US Department of Transportation for FFY 2011. Should any change in federal funding adversely affect the OTSO's ability to implement an approved agreement, the OTSO reserves the right to revise or terminate any approved grant in writing.

PROVISION 9 Supplanting

Federal funds must not be used to supplant state or local funds, meaning that federal funds must not be used to replace routine or local expenditures for costs of activities that constitute general expenses required to carry out the overall responsibilities of the sub-grantee and/or its sub-grantees.

The sub-grantee and contractor shall retain all required records for three years after grantee or sub-grantees make final payments and all other pending matters are closed.

PROVISION 14 Liability Disclaimer

The parties agree that the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Ohio Traffic Safety Office, is not the employer of any personnel involved in said contract. The sub-grantee agrees to pay any wages and related tax obligations resulting from employment of personnel in order to perform the terms of this contract.

PROVISION 15 Line of Credit

That the sub-grantee or contractor shall carry a credit line on the cover or first page of any report that reads substantially as follows:

“Funding provided in part or solely by the:
National Highway Traffic Safety Administration
Federal Highway Administration
Ohio Department of Public Safety
Ohio Traffic Safety Office

Studies, evaluations, etc., shall also include the following disclaimer.

“The opinions, findings, and conclusions expressed in this publication are those of the author and not necessarily those of, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, Federal Highway Administration, Ohio Department of Public Safety and the Ohio Traffic Safety Office.”

An ordinance amending Section 24. AUTHORIZED MANPOWER of Ordinance No. 10-89, Police Personnel Ordinance, as amended, to establish the classification of Sergeant and declaring the same to be an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 24. AUTHORIZED MANPOWER of Ordinance No. 10-89, Police Personnel Ordinance, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 24. AUTHORIZED MANPOWER:

That the total number of persons to be employed by the Police Department and the classifications set forth herein of the Police Department of the City of North Canton, Ohio, shall not exceed the following number of persons in each classification:

Police Chief	1
Police Lieutenant	2
Police Sergeant	4
Police Patrolman	18
Police Patrolman, Special	Unlimited
Chief Radio Dispatcher	1
Radio Dispatcher A & B	6
Radio Dispatcher C	Unlimited
Administrative Assistant	1
School Patrol, Regular	8
School Patrol, Extra	5

Section 2. That beginning January 1, 2010 the previous Police Lieutenant authorized manpower positions of six (6) will, through attrition or otherwise, be reduced to the current authorized number of two (2) positions and said positions opened through attrition or otherwise will be filled as four (4) Police Sergeant positions."

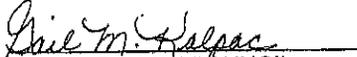

Section 2. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and further necessary to increase the number of full time sergeants, decrease the number of lieutenants, and to ensure the continued efficient operation of the Police Department; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six (6) or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor.

Please place the above subject matter on the Committee of the Whole agenda at your earliest convenience for the consideration of an ordinance authorizing the Mayor of North Canton through the Board of Control to purchase two (2) police cruisers to replace two (2) of our current older vehicles that are in use in the police department. The intent is to purchase these vehicles through the Ohio Cooperative Purchase Agreement as that has historically offered the lowest purchase price for the vehicle.

At the time of the budget it was known that Ford was not going to make the Crown Vic anymore however the make of cruiser and price the police would use to replace the Crown Vic were not confirmed at that point. The Chevrolet Caprice Cruiser will be the replacement and has a total price of **\$55453.00** for the two (2) cruisers.

I am asking to purchase the cruisers with funds from the following accounts since only \$50,000.00 was originally budgeted in the cruiser purchase account. We should still have enough funds in the equipment account to refit our cruisers.

Dear Mike:

I am ready to start the process of purchasing and equipping two 2012 Chevrolet Caprice Police V6 Sedans / vehicles for the police department. The state bid price is **\$25,772.00**.

I have attached a list of additional equipment options that each car will need. These additional options total **\$1954.50** including an additional minimum delivery charge of \$50.00/car. Therefore the purchase price for one vehicle is **\$27726.50**. The total purchase price for the two police cruisers is **\$55,453.00**.

In my October 17, 2011 budget response for 2012 budget requests I indicated two cruisers at \$50,000.00 and \$35,000.00 for cruiser/vehicle equipment conversions. Please note, availability of Ford police cruisers was not in place for 2012 and is being revamped for 2013. After careful study the police department has opted to purchase two 2012 Chevrolet Caprice Police Sedans. The state bid price for Chevrolet was not in place until 11-07-11. May 3, 2012 is the cut off date.

Therefore, I submit my request to city council and the board of control to allow purchases of these two vehicles for the police department under account #330.101.5500 for the year 2012.

Please place the above subject matter on the Committee of the Whole agenda at your earliest convenience for the consideration of an ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton through the Board of Control to purchase one (1) two and a half (2.5) ton International Cab and Chassis truck that will be utilized by the street department for primarily salting purposes not to exceed ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000.00).
