Ordinance No. 28 - 2016

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton to enter into a second amended support agreement, Phase IV, between the City of North Canton and Stark County Park District (Stark Parks), to permit the City to participate and provide its share of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, and declaring the same to be an emergency.


WHEREAS, an additional \$249,066.00 of state and federal funds has become available for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program;

WHEREAS, to continue to participate in the program, the City must contribute 32%, \$13,283.52, of the local share contribution of \$41,511.00, thereby permitting Stark Parks to receive an additional \$249,066.00 of state and federal funds to provide relief to residents in the Zimber Ditch area.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of North Canton is hereby authorized to enter into a second amended support agreement, Phase IV, to permit the City to continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
- Section 2. That in order to permit Stark Parks to accept an additional \$249,066.00 of state and federal funds to provide relief to residents in the Zimber Ditch project area, the City must contribute \$13,283.52, 32% of the local share contribution of \$41,511.00.
- Section 3. That the City has budgeted for said amount in the Zimber Ditch Fund – 209.745.5229.
- Section 4. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.
- Section 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton, and with other participating agencies awaiting the City's approval, time is of essence to move forward with the mitigation process to provide necessary relief to residents; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
