Ordinance No. – 2016

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton to prepare and submit an application for the Stark County Community Development Block Grant Program ("CDBG Program") Fiscal Year 2016, for a grant for the 7th Street NW Reconstruction Project, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Board of Stark County Commissioners participates in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development CDBG Program; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to submit an application, accept, and utilize a CDBG Program grant to fund the 7th Street NW Reconstruction Project.

NOW, THEREFORE; BE IT ORDINANCE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to prepare and submit an application to the CDBG Program for a grant for the 7th Street NW Reconstruction Project, from North Main Street to Emerson Avenue. The estimated cost of the street reconstruction project is \$350,000.00, with the City contributing approximately a 45% match of \$157,000.00, and the remaining cost cover by the CDBG Grant contributing 55% for \$192,500.00.
- Section 2. That, if any provision of this Ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Ordinance.
- Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and further necessary in order to meet the deadline to submit the application for the CDBG Program to obtain a grant for the 7th Street NW Reconstruction Project; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



Background: Stark County is a CDBG Entitlement County and they have changed the application period from once every three years to an annual process whereby communities within Stark County can submit (HUD) CDBG competitive project applications that meet CDBG eligibility requirements during a competitive application round. Since 2005, the City has submitted successful applications for CDBG funding receiving approximately \$1,500,000.00 in funding to replace streets, waterlines, and sanitary sewer lines in specific qualifying census tracks/block groups within the City. The Department of Permits and Development submitted an application for the 2016 funding round to replace approximately 3,140 L.F. of asphalt concrete surface, curb and gutters, 1,250 S.F. of sidewalk, replacement of drive approaches, storm inlet reconstruction, and new ADA curb ramps with dome plates on Seventh Street N.W. starting at North Main Street and ending at Emerson Avenue. At this time, we are requesting permission for the Mayor to accept and utilize a grant for street reconstruction.

Request: Requesting permission to accept and utilize a grant application to the Stark County CDBG program for the Fiscal Year 2016 Stark County CDBG Program. The grant is for the Seventh Street reconstruction project from North Main Street to Emerson Avenue. The estimated cost of the street reconstruction is \$350,000.00 with the City contributing approximately a forty-five percent (45%) match of \$157,000 and the CDBG Grant contributing a fifty-five percent (55%) match of \$192,500.00.

If Yes, Reason: The Board of County Commissioners Approved the FY 2016 Statement of Objectives and use of Funds including the North Canton Seventh Street N.W. Reconstruction project for funding in the amount of \$192,500.00. FY '16 Stark County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding, \$192,500.00, will be utilized to pay for the **construction cost only** of the replacement of asphalt/concrete surface, curb & gutter, sidewalks, concrete drive approaches, storm sewer inlets and ADA curb ramps with dome plates on 7th Street, NW to from Emerson Avenue, NW to North Main Street in the City of North Canton.

The City of North Canton will pay for all engineering costs associated with this project and any construction costs exceeding the amount of CDBG funding allocated to this project.

AGREEMENT FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT –
CITY OF NORTH CANTON – 7th STREET NW RECONSTRUCTION
PROJECT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this day by and between the Board of Stark County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the "County" and duly authorized through an Ordinance of the Board of Stark County Commissioners adopted this day, and the City of North Canton, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and duly authorized through an Ordinance of the City enacted on _____, 2016.

WITNESSETH: WHEREAS, the Board of Stark County Commissioners participates in the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

COPY

WHEREAS, the City has made application to the County for activities or projects to be funded under the County's CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the City certifies that will affirmatively further Fair Housing;
and

WHEREAS, by Resolution of May 11, 2016, the Board of Stark County Commissioners approved the FY 2016 Statement of Objectives and Use of Funds which included funding the North Canton – 7TH Street NW Reconstruction project hereinafter referred to as "project", in the amount of \$192,500.00; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the County and the City enter into an Agreement for the implementation of the project with a funding amount of \$192,500.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the provisions hereinabove and hereinafter contained, it is mutually agreed as follows:

SECTION 1. PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION

The City hereby authorizes the County to undertake on its behalf any and all work necessary for the implementation of said project. The Stark County Regional Planning Commission will administer the project on behalf of the Board of Stark County Commissioners as delineated in the contract for Administration of the CDBG program. This includes but is not limited to the following:

- A) Undertake the necessary work to complete an environmental review of the project described in Section 570.604 of the HUD regulations;
- B) Implement the necessary procedures for the Intergovernmental Review (IGR) review process as specified under Executive Order 12372, as described at Section 570.612;
- C) Prepare bidding specifications, advertise for bids, receive and open bids;
- D) Award and enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder;
- E) Make payments directly to the contractor based upon invoices approved by the County or their authorized representative;
- F) Keep all financial, payroll, and administrative records;
- G) Follow all applicable local, state, and federal requirements and regulations in carrying out the project.

SECTION 2.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

- A) The County hereby agrees to utilize funds made available under the CDBG program for the purpose of implementing the above mentioned activity as described in Exhibit A – Project Description which is attached hereto and made a part hereof the same as though rewritten herein in full.
- B) Changes to the Scope of Services may be requested by either the County or the City and shall be incorporated by fully executed amendments to this Agreement.

SECTION 3.

ALLOCATION/METHOD OF PAYMENT

- A. Allocation of CDBG funds:
 - 1) The County shall allocate funding from its FY 2016 CDBG program (B-16-UC-39-0005) in the amount of \$192,500.00 (one hundred ninety-two thousand five hundred dollars) for the payment of eligible project expenditures incurred by the County carrying out the project.
 - 2) The County may, at its discretion, either with or without the concurrence of the City, amend the project funding allocation for payment of costs in excess of the allocation of funds as specified in Section 3(a)1 above, if determined necessary for project implementation.
 - 3) The County may, at its sole discretion, reallocate any funding remaining upon completion of the project as described in Exhibit A. attached.
- B) Method of Payment
The County may make all payments on behalf of the City to the contractors, engineers, etc., based on invoices approved by the County or its authorized representatives. At no time shall payment be made to the City for payment of project invoices.

SECTION 4. TERMINATION

A. The County may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving at least thirty (30) days notice in writing to the City for the following reasons:

- 1) In the event the Secretary of HUD shall:
 - a) Withdraw funds allocated to the County under its application for program activities which substantially prevent performance of the Community Development program in the County;
 - b) Terminate the county's funding allocation pursuant to an act of Congress; or
 - c) Fail to approve a grant application by the County.
- 2) In the event that the County is unable to undertake the project due to physical barriers (i.e. unable to obtain easements, etc.)

SECTION 5. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No officer, employee, or agent of the County who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning or carrying out of the program, nor any immediate family member, close business associate or organization which is about to employ any such person, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect in this contract, and the County will take appropriate steps to assure compliance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That CHAPTER 1133 – SINGLE FAMILY AND TWO FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Specifically Section 1133.08 (c) (3) Additional Regulations for Garages, Parking Areas, Driveways and Vehicles, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1133.08 (c) Additional Regulations for Garages, Parking Areas, Driveways and Vehicles.

(3) Accessory off-street parking spaces located in the front yard shall adjoin the driveway between the driveway and the nearest side lot line. No accessory parking spaces are to be located directly in front of the dwelling unless the following specific conditions exist.

- (a) The property the dwelling is located on is an interior lot.
- (b) The dwelling has no access for a rear alley for accessory parking.
- (c) The dwelling does not have sufficient width between the existing driveway and the nearest side lot line to widen the existing driveway or extend the driveway into the rear yard.
- (d) If all of the above conditions exist, the Director of Permits and Development can permit one accessory parking space, not to exceed 240 square feet, in a front yard between the existing driveway and the farthest side yard lot line of the front yard. The maximum front yard coverage of all accessory parking spaces, existing sidewalks, porches or other paved areas (excluding the existing driveway) cannot exceed forty percent of the area of the front yard between the existing driveway and farthest side yard lot line and cannot be any closer than three feet from the right-of-way.

Section 2. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that it shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



As per conversations Department Staff has had with City Council Members concerning specific situations that exclude a property owner of an interior lot from adding an additional accessory parking space to the front yard, the following is a proposed draft to address the existing code:

Current Code – 1133.08 (c) (3)

(3) Accessory off-street parking spaces located in the front yard shall adjoin the driveway between the driveway and the nearest side lot line, provided parking spaces are not located directly in front of the building.

Proposed Changes

(3) Accessory off-street parking spaces located in the front yard shall adjoin the driveway between the driveway and the nearest side lot line. No accessory parking spaces are to be located directly in front of the dwelling unless the following specific conditions exist.

- A. The property the dwelling is located on is an interior lot.
- B. The dwelling has no access from a rear alley for accessory parking.
- C. The dwelling does not have sufficient width between the existing driveway and the nearest side lot line to widen the existing driveway or extend the driveway into the rear yard.
- D. If all of the above conditions exist, the Director of Permits and Development can permit one accessory parking space, not to exceed 240 square feet, in a front yard between the existing driveway and the farthest side yard lot line of the front yard. The Maximum front yard coverage of all accessory parking spaces, existing sidewalks, porches or other paved areas (excluding the existing driveway) cannot exceed forty percent (40%) of the area of the front yard between the existing driveway and farthest side yard lot line and cannot be any closer than three (3) feet from the right-of-way.

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and further necessary due to an oversight to include the Director of Law and Clerk of Council with other exempt employees with the update in the vacation levels; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 38 - 2016

An ordinance amending Section 10 VACATION REGULATIONS, of Chapter 155 Personnel Regulations of Part One - Administrative Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton to update the vacation levels of exempt employees in line with their contemporaries and thereby permit the City to promptly recruit, attract, and maintain highly trained and experienced leaders and managers, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Chapter 155 Personnel Regulations of Part One, Administrative Code, specifically, Section 1. GENERAL PERSONNEL REGULATIONS of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. **VACATION REGULATIONS**

1. For the sole purpose of the application of this Section 10., full-time employees who were employed by the City of North Canton in a calendar year prior to January 1, 2003 shall be deemed to have a service date of January 1 of that year in that year in which their employment commenced.

2. *Unless paragraph 3 of this section applies*, full-time exempt personnel may be granted a paid vacation allowance during the first year of employment up to a maximum of two calendar weeks at the discretion of the appointing authority.

A. Full-time employees having been employed less than one year, but not yet employed on January 1st, may be granted one day of vacation for each full month remaining in that calendar year, to a maximum of ten vacation days, effective on the first day of the first full month of employment during the calendar year, without the requirement of accrual.

B. Full-time exempt employees having been employed less than one year, but employed on January 1st, may be granted a paid vacation allowance of up to two calendar weeks in that calendar year of employment, effective January 1st, without the requirement of accrual.

3. *The appointing authority may grant up to four weeks of vacation for the positions of Director of Administration, Director of Finance, Deputy Director of Finance, City Engineer, Director of Economic Development, and Department Chief or Superintendent.*

- Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor.

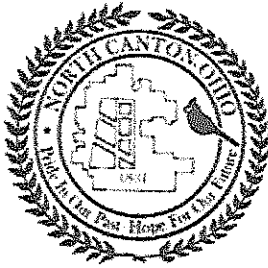

Ordinance No. 11-13

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Administration of the City of North Canton to advertise and receive bids according to specifications now on file in the office of the Director of Administration and authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton, through the Board of Control, to enter into a contract for the Price Park Culvert Rehabilitation Project, at a total cost not to exceed \$175,000, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Director of Administration of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to advertise and receive bids according to specifications now on file in the office of the Director of Administration, for the Price Park Culvert Rehabilitation Project.

Section 2. That the Mayor of City of North Canton, through the Board of Control, be, and is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the Price Park Culvert Rehabilitation Project, at a total cost not to exceed \$175,000.

Section 3. That the Director of Finance of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to draw funds necessary for the payment of the above specified contract from the following appropriation:

upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.

Section 4. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.

Section 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and further necessary for the timely completion of the Price Park Culvert Rehabilitation Project; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six (6) or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor.
