Ordinance No. - 2016

An ordinance authorizing the Chief of Police of the City of North Canton to dispose of unclaimed property, such as bicycles and bicycle parts, in the custody of the Police Department, by donating the unclaimed property to the Salvation Army, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

WHEREAS, due to its limited storage space, and its generosity, North Canton's Police Department desires to donate unclaimed bicycles and bicycle parts to the Salvation Army.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- Section 1. That the Chief of Police of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to dispose of unclaimed property such as bicycles and bicycle parts in the custody of the Police Department by donating the unclaimed property to the Salvation Army, a 501(c)(3) charitable organization.
- Section 2. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.
- Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton and immediately necessary for the police department to donate the unclaimed property to the Salvation Army permitting it to clean, repair, and refurbish bicycles in time for the holiday season; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approved by the Mayor, Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law .

Subject: Legislation – Donation of Bicycles

I am requesting legislation that would authorize our Chief of Police to dispose of found unclaimed property that are bicycles or bicycle parts to be donated to the Salvation Army, a 501(c)(3) charitable organization.

The Police Department continually runs into a space storage situation for unclaimed bicycles between scheduled city auctions. Most of these bicycles are in very poor condition and do not bring in much auction money. The Salvation Army has a program that accepts donated bicycles and parts, reconditions them and gives them to youth in Stark County that may need but not able to afford a bicycle. We did this before in 2014 which was authorized by city ordinance 84-2014.

Ohio Revised Code 737.32 allows the Chief of Police to contribute property to public or nonprofit organizations when authorized by ordinance by the legislative authority of a municipal corporation.

I am asking that if so authorized, the ordinance be passed as an emergency after the required readings by Council so that the Chief of Police may clear his bicycle storage area as soon as possible.

Ordinance No. - 2016

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton to enter into a third amended support agreement, Phase V, between the City of North Canton and Stark County Park District (Stark Parks), to enable Stark Parks to apply for additional Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") grant funds in furtherance of the Zimber Ditch Area Hazard Mitigation Program, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

WHEREAS, Stark Parks wishes to apply for additional FEMA grant funds, \$788,230.00, to further support the Zimber Ditch Area Hazard Mitigation Program; and

WHEREAS, this grant program requires a commitment of local matching funds from participating agencies such as the Stark County Commissioners, the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District, and the City of North Canton; and

WHEREAS, if Stark Parks is awarded the above-described FEMA grant for Phase V, the Mitigation Program will be able to satisfy its commitment to the 19 North Canton homeowners who applied for relief; and

WHEREAS, in order to bring relief to the remaining homeowners, North Canton wishes to contribute its share, \$63,058.50, towards the FEMA grant application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- Section 1. That in order to permit Stark Parks apply for a FEMA grant of an additional \$788,230.00 of funds to provide relief to homeowners in the Zimber Ditch area, the City must contribute its local share, \$63,058.40, of a matching contribution.
- Section 2. That because the Mayor and City Council desire to assist all of the 19 homeowners that have applied for mitigation relief, the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a third amended support agreement between the City and Stark Parks to enable Stark Parks to apply for additional FEMA grant funds in furtherance of Phase V of Zimber Ditch Area Hazard Mitigation Program.
- Section 3. That the City has budgeted for said amount in the Zimber Ditch Fund - 209.745.5229.

- Section 4. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.
- Section 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and peace of the City of North Canton, and because time is of the essence to commit the City's matching funds, thereby permitting Stark Parks to meet the FEMA grant application deadline, and to timely bring relief to local homeowners with the Mitigation Program; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Subject: Zimber Ditch Mitigation Project – Phase 5

I am requesting Council to consider an ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton to enter into an additional agreement between the City of North Canton and Stark County Park District (Stark Parks), to permit the City to participate and provide its share in a FEMA grant program as part of the Zimber Ditch area hazard mitigation program. The funds will be used to continue the acquisition of houses in the flood area.

Stark Parks is applying for additional grant funds through a FEMA program and this grant is different from the earlier grant funds in that the State of Ohio does not participate in matching funds. The State of Ohio requires a commitment for the matching funds from the participating agencies before they will finalize the award amount. The City of North Canton is asked to commit our share of the match at \$63,058.40.
