## Division of Permits and Inspections

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### Notice to All Residential Builders and Contractors

These updated submittal requirements SHALL take effect 11/1/2017

The City of North Canton Division of Permits and Inspections per Section 108.2 of the 2013 Residential Code of Ohio w/January 2016 updates will be performing the following inspections:

1. Footing
2. Foundation (includes drain tile, anchor bolts, downspouts)
3. Pre-pour for crawl spaces, garages, porches, stoops, basement floors
4. Underground Plumbing (includes gas piping system(s)- prior to concealing under basement floor(s), crawl space floor(s), garage floors)
5. Rough plumbing (includes gas piping system(s)-walls/floors prior to concealing-See testing requirements Section 312 Oct. 10, 2016 update/ See testing requirement for gas testing Section 2417 of the 2013 Residential Code of Ohio w/January 2016 updates)
6. Underground HVAC (includes trenches for heating ducts prior to concealing)
7. Rough HVAC (prior to concealing)
8. Underground Electrical (includes trenches for services, yard lights, etc.)
9. Rough Electrical (prior to concealing)
10. Rough Framing (includes draft/fire stopping and prior to concealing)
11. Energy efficiency (Insulation)
12. Gypsum Board (only if part of a fire-resistive assembly or shear assembly)
13. Fire-resistant penetrations (usually 2 or 3 family dwellings)
14. Final Heating
15. Final Electrical
16. Final Plumbing (See testing requirements Section 312 Oct. 10, 2016 update-also includes testing gas piping system(s) See testing requirement for gas testing Section 2417 of the 2013 Residential Code of Ohio w/January 2016 updates)
17. Final Building
18. Issue Certificate of Occupancy

Special inspections that may occur on a project would be solid grouting of concrete masonry units, soil report (such as but not limited to: poor soil conditions, backfill which exceeds the

limits in Section 506.2.1, etc.) The owner/builder/contractor would be responsible to provide a report from a third-party person or agency to the Building Official.

Failure to call in for an inspection may result in the missed inspection being placed on the Certificate of Occupancy.

Failure to have the inspection card on the job-site and the approved set of construction documents may result in the inspection not being performed and affecting the flow of the project.

The City of North Canton Division of Permits and Inspections would like a 24-hour notice for scheduling your inspection.
