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MAYOR WILDER: Well, good morning, everyone. 1 2 Mayor Steve Wilder here for the board of control for 3 the City of North Canton holding our regular meeting on Tuesday, February 1, 2022, at 9 a.m. here at city 4 5 hall. First order of business will be our call to 6 7 order. Patrick DeOrio. 8 MR. DEORIO: Here. 9 MAYOR WILDER: Jina Alaback. 10 MS. ALABACK: Here. 11 MAYOR WILDER: Wayne Boyer. 12 MR. BOYER: Here. 13 MAYOR WILDER: Steve Wilder is here. Also 14 joining us today, let the record show that Mr. Rob 15 Graham, our city engineer, is joining us. 16 MR. DEORIO: And Kelly Hart. 17 MAYOR WILDER: And Kelly Hart, our 18 administrative specialist, is also assisting today. 19 For approval of minutes, in your packet 20 should be 3A, approval of the minutes of January 12, 2.1 2022. May I have a motion to approve those minutes. 22 MS. ALABACK: So moved. 23 MAYOR WILDER: So moved. May I have a

second.

MR. DEORIO:

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MAYOR WILDER: Very fine. Any other discussion, changes, amendments to the minutes? If not, all in favor, say "aye."

("Aye" in unison.)

MAYOR WILDER: Opposed, "nay." Motion carries. Approved.

On Item No. 4, New Business, it's the approval of Ordinance No. 15-2022. With that, I'm going to open it up for discussion for the board. If anyone would like to discuss that ordinance. Would you want me to read that ordinance for the record?

MR. DEORIO: No. I don't think that's necessary. But basically this was an idea brought forward from our finance director, her experience, we did this the first time last year; council liked it as well. And it's basically taking the projects that we are anticipating doing that exceed 50,000 in value, they have already been budgeted, and to kick it up to the board of control and accept this and then be able to move forward with any of these projects A through K as it relates to bidding them out moving forward. Is that right; Jina?

MS. ALABACK: Correct. Yes.

MAYOR WILDER: Very fine. Anything else anyone would like to add?

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MR. DEORIO: Rob, do you have any?

MR. GRAHAM: I guess I would just have a question, but let's say Project K, Valley Drive Water Line Replacement. You know, at this point we know we have \$395,000 in the CDBG grants from the commissioners. The commissioners, because of that, will hold a contract. That won't be bid until September or so when the commissioners get their check from HUD. So after that, once the commissioners bid it and we know our exact contract amounts and who the three-way contract will be with, though it will be us, we know the commissioners, we don't know the construction firm yet, would we need to then have another board of control, as we typically would, to award the final dollar amount or is today's proceedings enough if this were to pass that we don't have to do it again?

MAYOR WILDER: Do you think that would be enough?

MS. ALABACK: I know your projects are a little bit different because we have already pulled two of them off our budget list that exceeded the 50,000 and had separate board of control meetings for those specifically. So maybe -- I understand what you're saying. Maybe it would be best to remove Item

K from board of control and then accept that one when we get to that point. We'll know what it is, how much it is, who it is, for the commissioners.

MR. GRAHAM: That's my question. It's the kind of money that you put into it but --

MS. ALABACK: Because we'll have to have another one to award the contract so there's no sense in having it twice.

MR. GRAHAM: Right. I mean, I guess it doesn't hurt and you know that it's coming, but still --

MS. ALABACK: These others, like the valve-turning truck, the ambulance, it allows us then to go ahead, and like, we're required to get financing for those pieces of equipment, and so then this board of control will authorize maybe go out and find banks to finance those equipments, or any of the other projects on the list.

Well, and actually Rob, same thing with the Stratavon sewer. Do we want to remove that until we're ready to do the project, which may not be this year at all now timing-wise.

MR. DEORIO: Well, let's keep in mind here that, you know, what council has authorized here is for us to advertise, receive bids, and then to enter

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into contracts after that process is over. So I don't know that we want to remove anything from the list. They're just authorizing us to start with that. Witwer Ball Field, advertise, receive bids and then just go ahead and not have to run it back through city council. They're authorizing us to do the project.

MS. ALABACK: This is just the premeeting basically. But we'll still come back on your projects.

MR. DEORIO: We're going to come back on probably all of them.

MAYOR WILDER: That's what I thought we would do. Have another board of control meeting to adjust those projects as they come forward.

MR. GRAHAM: Okay.

 $$\operatorname{MR}.$ DEORIO: But this allows you all to move forward with --

MR. GRAHAM: Advertising. Right. Right.

MR. DEORIO: Yeah.

MAYOR WILDER: It's good discussion.

Well, if there's nothing else to come before the board, then I'll make a motion that we accept Ordinance 15-2022 that authorizes the director of administration in the City of North Canton to

advertise and receive bids, according to specifications established by the department of administration, and authorizing the mayor, upon board of control approval, to enter into the contracts for the completion of those projects and purchases over \$50,000 and budgeted for in the 2022 annual budget as adopted by Ordinance 64-2021.

MS. ALABACK: Second.

MR. DEORIO: Third.

MAYOR WILDER: Second. All in favor?

("Aye" in unison.)

MAYOR WILDER: Opposed, "nay." The motion carries. Thank you.

On 4B, we have a second ordinance, it's -MR. DEORIO: I would just like to clarify for
the record that when you said "nay," that was what
you were signaling that people should say if they
voted that way.

MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

MR. DEORIO: But you were not voting that.

MAYOR WILDER: No. No. I'm voting yes, or aye. Okay. Opposed would be nay. There was no nays and so the motion carries. Thank you.

Okay. Approval of Ordinance No. 18-2022.

And that involves an ordinance authorizing the mayor

of the City of North Canton, upon the board of control, to enter into an agreement for the purchase of the real property located on Orion Street,

Northwest, in the city of North Canton, Stark County,
Ohio, known as City Outlot 325, Permanent Parcel No.
9209052, and the property at a cost not to exceed \$397,600.

MR. DEORIO: So we have this matter, we are timed to respond under the proposed agreement is till March 4, so council passed this last night on emergency. So we would be able to instruct legal counsel to notify the other party that we have done our part, we're ready to proceed, and any paperwork that would need to be adjusted we would be able to sign and move forward. So I would move that upon completion of any or all forms and paperwork necessary to acquire this property as prepared by legal counsel that the board of control, through the mayor, be able to sign — move that they be able to sign and accept this purchase.

MS. ALABACK: I'll second.

MAYOR WILDER: Okay. So that motion is on the floor and it was made by Mr. DeOrio to accept this Ordinance 18-2022, second by Alaback. Roll call vote?
