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1 MR. YOUNG: All right. It is the  
2 appointed hour. I am going to go live.

3 MR. PETERS: All right.

4 MR. YOUNG: When you are ready, Mr.  
5 President.

6 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you, Ben.  
7 At this time, I would like to call to order  
8 the North Canton City Council meeting, April  
9 12th, 2021. The time is 7:00 p.m.

10 Mark, Dominic, would you like to lead us  
11 in prayer?

12 MR. CERRETA: I'd be glad to.

13 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you, Mark.

14 (Whereupon, Mr. Cerreta leads us in  
15 prayer.)

16 MR. PETERS: Thank you, Mark. All right.  
17 At this time, if you would join me in the  
18 Pledge of Allegiance.

19 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance is  
20 recited.)

21 MR. PETERS: All right. Ben, at this  
22 time, would you please call the roll?

23 MR. YOUNG: Member Stroia.

24 MR. STROIA: Here.

25 MR. YOUNG: Member Revoldt.

1 MR. REVOLDT: Here.

2 MR. YOUNG: Member Peters.

3 MR. PETERS: Here.

4 MR. YOUNG: Member Cerreta.

5 MR. CERRETA: Here.

6 MR. YOUNG: Member Foltz.

7 MR. FOLTZ: Here.

8 MR. YOUNG: Member Werren.

9 MR. CERRETA: Are you on mute, Steph?

10 MS. WERREN: Yeah, I'm on. Yeah, sorry

11 about that, you guys. I don't have -- we

12 have Spectrum here, so if -- I'm in and out

13 of data. So sorry about that.

14 MR. YOUNG: And Member Fonte.

15 MR. FONTE: Here.

16 MR. YOUNG: Seven present.

17 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you. At

18 this time, for your consideration, I need a

19 motion and a second to approve as presented

20 minutes from March 15th, Committee of the

21 Whole, minutes from March 22nd, City Council,

22 minutes from March 22nd, Committee of the

23 Whole, and March 2021 financial report.

24 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz moves to approve as

25 presented.

1 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta seconds.

2 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

3 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

4 MR. PETERS: Aye.

5 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

6 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

7 MS. WERREN: Aye.

8 MR. FONTE: Aye.

9 MR. STROIA: Aye.

10 MR. PETERS: Opposed?

11 (No response.)

12 MR. PETERS: All right. Motion carries.

13 Okay. At this time, we have recognition

14 of the public. We have three guests tonight.

15 Ben, at this time, I will turn it over to

16 you. Just a quick reminder, five-minute time

17 limit. And go from there. Ben, take it

18 away.

19 MR. YOUNG: All right. Mr. Davis, you

20 are first. Can you hear us?

21 MR. DAVIS: Loud and clear. Brad Davis,

22 1678 Meadowlane Drive, Southeast. Good

23 evening, Mr. Mayor and Council members. I

24 was going to speak on a tool that's missing

25 from the City's toolbox, as Councilman Fonte

1 likes to say. But from -- from my  
2 investigation, along with help from  
3 Mr. Revoldt, Mr. Cerreta, Mrs. Werren, and  
4 Mr. Hill, I have come to the conclusion that  
5 tool won't make the box.

6 That tool happens to be a location to  
7 deposit green waste. I can see from the  
8 information received from Mr. Hill, the  
9 executive director of the recycling district,  
10 it won't be possible for North Canton  
11 residents to use the Lake Township or Plain  
12 Township green waste location or to have a  
13 location in North Canton.

14 There are two possible solutions for a  
15 resident. Number one, you can put your green  
16 waste in the household trash container.  
17 Number two, if you have pickup loads like  
18 myself, you can go to Earth 'n Wood or  
19 Mr. Mulch and pay 12 bucks a load.

20 Again, I would like to thank Council  
21 members mentioned for their support, along  
22 with communication from Mr. Hill. Thank you  
23 for your time.

24 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you, Brad.

25 MR. FONTE: Thanks, Brad.

1                   MR. YOUNG: Mr. Mulqueen, you are up  
2 next.

3                   MR. MULQUEEN: All righty. Hi. My name  
4 is Joseph Mulqueen. I'm a proud disabled,  
5 recovering alcoholic who lives at 1016 Park  
6 Avenue, Northeast. And what brings me in  
7 today is I'm here to inform my City Council  
8 and Mayor that I have taken the time and  
9 liberty to write letters to Governor Mike  
10 DeWine, State Representative Diane Grendell,  
11 State Representative Anthony Gonzalez, and  
12 Senator Rob Portman about asking for help  
13 with the renovation of Dogwood Skate Park.

14                   I'm not here to point the fingers or  
15 blame anybody for why we haven't had a  
16 renovated skate park. I'm just here to take  
17 the initiative action and use my ten toes and  
18 my ten hands to get this project done. I  
19 have \$10,000 I'm willing to put on the table  
20 to start the fund-raiser with.

21                   I'm kindly asking, you know, the state  
22 representatives, governor, and senator if  
23 they had anything, if they can contribute,  
24 too. And I'm a firm believer that the Ohio  
25 Republican party members will be willing to

1 donate to a project like this. I'm hoping  
2 the fellow Democrats of Ohio can join us with  
3 this donation and we can show the world how  
4 we come together in Ohio and we unite despite  
5 politically contentious times. Because if we  
6 don't show the kids how we unite, they'll  
7 never learn how to unite despite politically  
8 contentious times that we are living in.

9 And, you know, like I said, I'm not here  
10 to point the finger or blame anyone. I'm  
11 here to take responsibility and action upon  
12 myself. I wish my fellow colleagues I went  
13 to school with that grew up at Dogwood Park  
14 would do their fair share of tithing their  
15 paycheck and donate with me. But I can't  
16 speak for them. I can only speak for myself.

17 And I can't thank the town enough for  
18 giving me the skate park brand new as a  
19 child, as I'm right now trying to do  
20 everything in my power to give these kids a  
21 brand new park, so they can have the same  
22 feeling I once had as a kid, and they'll have  
23 the passion and drive I do have for  
24 skateboarding, and also for volunteering and  
25 wanting to fix up their local communities.



1                   And, you know, I'm here to make sure the  
2 Dogwood Skate Park stays at Dogwood. The  
3 lights work there perfect every night. I'm  
4 usually out there every night. And the  
5 lights are working great. And I can't thank  
6 the town enough for getting these lights back  
7 on, because I'm a firm believer the skate  
8 park will keep kids off of drugs and alcohol.

9                   And now that skateboarding is in the  
10 Olympics, it can lead to the Olympics like  
11 Mr. Logan once did and was able to honor his  
12 family and this town and his friends and to  
13 make a name for himself on this God-given  
14 talent. And so wherever it is, skateboarding  
15 is my God-given talent. And for some reason,  
16 teaching skateboarding is now my new  
17 God-given talent, as this one kid I'm  
18 teaching now is progressing faster than any  
19 other kid I ever seen in my 19 years of  
20 skateboarding. And, you know, I don't want  
21 to see his skate park uprooted and taken  
22 somewhere else, because Dogwood Skate Park is  
23 the most family-friendly skate park in Stark  
24 County.

25                   Sadly, all the skate parks in Canton are

1 in low income neighborhoods and they are  
2 really plagued with violence. I pray  
3 every -- each and every night that the  
4 violence, you know, stops. But, sadly, you  
5 do a statistics report, and violent crime has  
6 gone up in Canton. A kid has even got shot  
7 at Harmont -- at Harmont Skate Park in  
8 Canton. I don't know why that skate park is  
9 still open. I don't know how the parents  
10 can't sue the town of Canton for his kid  
11 being shot over a bike at Harmont Skate Park.  
12 But, you know, may God bless the bump.

13 But I'm just here to -- to try to get  
14 this skate park renovated. I'm here to kick  
15 start a fund-raiser. I have 10 grand to  
16 bring to the table. And all it takes is nine  
17 other people to match my 10 grand and we have  
18 \$100,000. And maybe we can go down to our  
19 local banks and ask for help.

20 I'm just here to ask for help, like I  
21 asked for help from Governor DeWine, State  
22 Representative Diane Grendell, Anthony  
23 Gonzalez, and Senator Rob Portman, who was a  
24 very great lawyer before he became a senator.  
25 And I know Rob Portman would stand behind me

1 and make sure Dogwood Skate Park doesn't get  
2 destroyed.

3 Now it's going on 19, 20 years. I think  
4 it's now a historic park in the State of  
5 Ohio, and I'm sure there is grant funding to  
6 add to whatever grant funding there is. But  
7 I will not let a skate park and basketball  
8 court be discriminated from any funding that  
9 is going on at the Dogwood Park right now.

10 So that being said, may God bless this  
11 renovation. Thank you.

12 MS. WERREN: Thank you. Thanks for your  
13 donation.

14 MR. PETERS: Thank you, Joe.

15 MR. YOUNG: Our last speaker tonight is  
16 Mr. Osborne. When you are ready.

17 MR. OSBORNE: I am here. Can you hear  
18 me?

19 MR. YOUNG: We can.

20 MR. OSBORNE: Chuck Osborne, 307 Fairview  
21 Street, Southeast, North Canton, Ohio. On  
22 the eve of Thanksgiving last year, this  
23 Council held a hastily-called Special Council  
24 meeting to enact legislation creating a  
25 Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area. It was

1 Ordinance Number 55-2020.

2 Had I not made an inquiry to the state  
3 liquor commission following the previous  
4 Monday night's Council meeting and had the  
5 response from the liquor commission been made  
6 to me instead of to City Hall, the deadline  
7 for passing set by the state would have  
8 lapsed and the entire process would have had  
9 to start all over.

10 At last week's Committee of the Whole  
11 meeting, City Administrator DeOrio stated  
12 that the cost for required trash receptacles  
13 for the previously enacted much larger DORA  
14 had encompassed entirely -- nearly the entire  
15 length of Main Street would have cost  
16 \$26,000. Ordinance Number 28-2021 on  
17 tonight's agenda seeks to shrink the size of  
18 the DORA that was created last year. And  
19 now, according to Mr. DeOrio, the cost of  
20 required trash containers for this downsized  
21 DORA is pegged at \$9,000.

22 As fiduciaries of public monies, it is  
23 the responsibility of this legislative body  
24 to spend tax dollars wisely and prudently  
25 protect the City from undo risk. How long

1 will it take for the City to sell 9,000  
2 plastic cups to recoup the cost of the trash  
3 containers?

4 The DORA that was enacted late -- late  
5 last year and the revised DORA legislation  
6 tonight both present undue risk for taxpayers  
7 right out of the chute, as there is nothing  
8 in the legislation that requires  
9 participation by all four liquor operators.  
10 As has been made clear, state law requires  
11 liquor operators to sell the alcoholic drinks  
12 in official North Canton DORA cups. These  
13 cups would be purchased from the City in lots  
14 of 500 for a minimum of a dollar each.

15 Do each of these liquor operators feel  
16 this venture has any economic benefit for  
17 their business? I seriously doubt it. How  
18 long should taxpayers wait to recoup the  
19 \$9,000 cost for all the required trash  
20 receptacles?

21 It is not prudent for this legislative  
22 body to expend taxpayer dollars and hope  
23 those dollars will be recouped by thousands  
24 desperate to drink beer in North Canton's  
25 Bitzer Park or on the steps of Saint Paul's

1 church. Council is exposing taxpayers to a  
2 loss of \$9,000 without regard for its  
3 fiduciary responsibility, as there is no  
4 commitment to purchase the \$1 16-ounce  
5 official DORA plastic cups that did allow  
6 drinkers to wander city streets with an open  
7 container of alcohol.

8 I might add here that Sam's Club sells  
9 16-ounce plastic cups for 7 cents a piece.  
10 But, of course, without the official DORA  
11 cup, one would be in violation of open  
12 container laws. To greatly diminish risks  
13 for taxpayers, any DORA legislation should  
14 require a commitment from each of the four  
15 liquor operators that they will purchase a  
16 minimum quantity of official North Canton  
17 DORA cups from the City. The purchase  
18 commitments from the four liquor operators  
19 should recoup the expected \$9,000 cost of the  
20 trash receptacles in no more than two years.

21 This Council should be mindful that you  
22 are expending tax dollars for economic  
23 benefit of private business. To have nearly  
24 a clue as to whether this expenditure of  
25 public monies will ever be recouped is

1           disconcerting. Anything less than requiring  
2           purchase commitments from the four liquor  
3           operators and this body is not living up to  
4           the fiduciary responsibility that this  
5           legislative body owes to the citizens of  
6           North Canton, and further, that is required  
7           by law.

8           I have spoken to El Rincon numerous times  
9           since last fall. They are not wanting to  
10          participate. Pav's Creamery has told me the  
11          16-ounce plastic sippy cups, I call them, are  
12          not adequate to serve their alcoholic shake.  
13          I went up to Sapphire game and parlor.  
14          Nobody is going to want to walk up 20 steps,  
15          navigate down through a hall to a back room  
16          and buy a beer, and then walk back down  
17          outside. It would be much easier to just buy  
18          a beer from Howlin Bird.

19          So you are going to be stuck recouping  
20          your \$9,000, and this is a mis-expenditure  
21          and a failure to be fiduciary responsible  
22          for --

23               MR. PETERS: Thank you, Mr. Osborne.

24               MR. OSBORNE: -- public tax dollars.

25               MR. PETERS: Your time has elapsed.

1 MR. OSBORNE: I understand that,  
2 Mr. Peters.

3 MR. PETERS: Thank you.

4 MR. FONTE: Thanks, Chuck.

5 MR. PETERS: Okay. All right. Ben, you  
6 ready to move on? There we go. Okay.  
7 Moving on to old business. May I have a  
8 motion and a second to read by title only  
9 Ordinance 3-21?

10 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.

11 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta seconds.

12 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

13 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

14 MR. PETERS: Aye.

15 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

16 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

17 MS. WERREN: Aye.

18 MR. FONTE: Aye.

19 MR. STROIA: Aye.

20 MR. PETERS: Opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 MR. PETERS: Motion carries.

23 Ben.

24 MR. YOUNG: An ordinance amending the  
25 zoning map of the City of North Canton to



1 reclassify 309 Lindy Lane, Northwest, Stark  
2 County parcel number 9205115, as recommended  
3 by the Planning Commission in accordance with  
4 the amendment procedure as set forth in  
5 Chapter 1182 of the planning and zoning code,  
6 from park and institutional to one family  
7 residential, R50, in order to bring the  
8 zoning districts map and pertinent parcels in  
9 line with the current uses, together with  
10 providing opportunities for future residents  
11 and businesses.

12 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you.

13 Chairman Revoldt.

14 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you. As we all know,  
15 the church requested that its manse, which  
16 had been previously zoned P and I, be rezoned  
17 to residential. You'll note on the map that  
18 it is that -- that trapezoid in yellow. We  
19 had no opposition to the zoning, and it  
20 aligns with the current use as a rental  
21 property.

22 Are there any questions?

23 (No response.)

24 MR. REVOLDT: If there are none, I move  
25 we adopt the third reading of Ordinance 3-21.

1 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta seconds.  
2 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."  
3 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.  
4 MR. PETERS: Aye.  
5 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.  
6 MR. CERRETA: Aye.  
7 MS. WERREN: Aye.  
8 MR. FONTE: Aye.  
9 MR. STROIA: Aye.  
10 MR. PETERS: Opposed?  
11 (No response.)  
12 MR. PETERS: Motion carries.  
13 All right. May I have a motion and a  
14 second to read by title only Ordinance 2-21?  
15 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.  
16 MS. WERREN: Werren seconds.  
17 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."  
18 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.  
19 MR. PETERS: Aye.  
20 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.  
21 MR. CERRETA: Aye.  
22 MS. WERREN: Aye.  
23 MR. STROIA: Aye.  
24 MR. PETERS: Opposed?  
25 MR. FONTE: Fonte abstains.

1 MR. PETERS: Fonte abstains. Passes 6-0.

2 Ben.

3 MR. YOUNG: An ordinance repealing and  
4 replacing part 17, housing code, of the  
5 codified ordinances of the City of North  
6 Canton.

7 MR. PETERS: All right. Chairman  
8 Revoldt, am I going to --

9 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you.

10 MR. PETERS: -- move through these?

11 MR. REVOLDT: We will. Just before we  
12 get -- just to refresh everyone's memory,  
13 2-21 is our new property maintenance code for  
14 both commercial and residential properties.  
15 The following items, 7C, D, and E, form the  
16 administrative structure -- or reform the  
17 administrative structure for the  
18 administration of maintenance code. And then  
19 we get into 7F through G. Those are  
20 primarily housekeeping, where we are  
21 moving -- we are relocating chapters back  
22 into that housing code itself.

23 So if -- what I'd like to do is we'll  
24 just go ahead and vote, and then if we have  
25 anything that comes up, I guess we'll ask at

1 the time. But if there are no other  
2 questions on 2-21, I move we adopt the third  
3 reading.

4 MS. WERREN: Werren, second.

5 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

6 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

7 MR. PETERS: Aye.

8 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

9 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

10 MS. WERREN: Aye.

11 MR. STROIA: Aye.

12 MR. PETERS: Opposed?

13 MR. FONTE: Fonte abstains.

14 MR. PETERS: Fonte abstains. Passes 6-0.

15 All right. May I have --

16 MR. REVOLDT: Okay.

19 about 7 -- 7C?

20 (No response.)

21 MR. REVOLDT: I guess you need to make --  
22 make a motion to read it. So I move we read  
23 it.

1 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."  
2 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

21 third reading of Ordinance 11-21.  
22 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz seconds.  
23 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

1 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.  
2 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

2 MR. PETERS: All right. May I have a

5 MR. PETERS: Oh, go ahead.

6 MR. REVOLDT: Just real quick, are there  
7 any questions?

8 (No response.)

9 MR. REVOLDT: If not, I -- I move we  
10 adopt third reading Ordinance 12-21.

11 MS. WERREN: Werren, second.

12 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

13 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

14 MR. PETERS: Aye.

15 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

16 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

17 MS. WERREN: Aye.

22 All right. May I have a motion and a  
23 second to read by title only Ordinance 15-21?

24 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.

25 MS. WERREN: Werren, second.

1 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."  
2 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.  
3 MR. PETERS: Aye.  
4 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.  
5 MR. CERRETA: Aye.  
6 MS. WERREN: Aye.  
7 MR. FONTE: Aye.  
8 MR. STROIA: Aye.  
9 MR. YOUNG: Point of order, we are on  
10 Ordinance 13.  
11 MS. WERREN: 13.  
12 MR. PETERS: Yes. Oh, what did I say?  
13 MR. FOLTZ: You said 15, Jeff.  
14 MR. PETERS: Fifteen? I'm sorry.  
15 MS. WERREN: Jeff, slow down.  
16 MR. PETERS: Okay. So we had a motion  
17 and a second. And did we roll call that?  
18 MR. FOLTZ: We've got to say for 13,  
19 though.  
20 MR. PETERS: Okay.

22 this. I'll move that we read by title only

14 sections of Chapter 139, department of  
15 engineering, of the codified ordinances of  
16 the City of North Canton in order to remove  
17 the division of permits and inspection.  
18 MR. PETERS: Okay.  
19 MR. REVOLDT: Questions?  
20 (No response.)  
21 MR. REVOLDT: I move we adopt the third  
22 reading of ordinance -- move adoption of the

19 getting ahead of myself here. Daryl.

21 MR. REVOLDT: Let me pour myself a glass  
22 of wine. Come on. Well, as -- as  
23 Mr. Osborne has reminded us, this -- this has  
24 come to us since November for a revision, and  
25 this has come at the administration's

1 request. I think all of us will agree it's a  
2 wise request, and I think it just sets the  
3 stage. We don't have any events or  
4 activities yet planned. We may see some in  
5 the near future. But, again, this is the --  
6 this is part of the experiment of -- of  
7 launching economic development activity and  
8 activities in downtown North Canton.

9 So if there aren't any questions or  
10 additional comments -- are there?

11 MR. FONTE: I have a question. It's Dom.

12 MR. REVOLDT: Yeah. Yes, Dom.

13 MR. FONTE: Yeah, I was just saying, like  
14 what -- what Mr. Osborne said is true; you  
15 know, it does cost taxpayer money. But we  
16 are spending taxpayer -- that's what we have  
17 to do is manage it, take a little bit of  
18 risk. But this is kind of a calculated one.  
19 And you said in the sense that we can quickly  
20 adjust, modify, cancel, whatever we want to  
21 do.

22 So we are just going to do this small  
23 segment as we go into 720 or other activities  
24 throughout the summer. And, again, this is a  
25 tool in the tool bag to help small businesses



1 as they think about coming to the area, and  
2 the ones that want to dip their toe in and  
3 check it out. I mean, it's kind of a little  
4 experiment, like you said. I don't believe,  
5 you know, anybody -- we'll know in six  
6 months. Like I think you said, we'll bring  
7 it back in October. Was it October, Daryl?

8 MR. REVOLDT: Yeah.

9 MR. FONTE: And we see how it went  
10 through the summer. And I think that's a  
11 fair representation. And I think we are  
12 being prudent by just doing a small segment.  
13 Let's test the water, let's see how it goes,  
14 make adjustments. Let's not curse the wind;  
15 let's adjust our sails. And it's for the  
16 betterment of the community.

17 MR. REVOLDT: Dominic, this is Revoldt.  
18 Dominic, thank you. Because you may recall  
19 back in November, one of the points I tried  
20 to make is that we are going to experiment.  
21 We are going to do our homework. We are  
22 going to do our very best to implement good  
23 and sound policies and practices.

24 But we -- as I indicated then, we  
25 shouldn't hesitate to bring things back if we

1 want to fine tune them. And here we are five  
2 months later, we are going to come back and  
3 we are going to shrink it down a little bit.  
4 And in six months, we may find that we want  
5 to do some -- move it a slightly different  
6 direction. And I think that's just part of  
7 good management; staying on top of what we  
8 have got and -- I don't want to use the word  
9 tweak, but adjust due to circumstances. So  
10 I'm comfortable with this.

11 MR. FONTE: Yeah. No, I agree with that,  
12 Daryl.

13 MR. CERRETA: I have got a couple things,  
14 because I have respectfully not supported  
15 this, and a couple different reasons why. I  
16 think Chuck makes some good points. If  
17 these -- these businesses have to agree -- I  
18 mean, I found the same thing; I mean, Pav's  
19 is not going to let it out of their building,  
20 and El Rincon does not agree to this.

21 So do we need a contract with these  
22 people to say that they will -- they will,  
23 you know, be involved in this or not?  
24 Because if they -- if they don't, those two  
25 down at that end, what's the point of it?

1 MR. REVOLDT: Well, what you need, Mark,  
2 is you need four -- four licenses within a  
3 certain geographic area.

4 MR. CERRETA: Right. Do they have to  
5 agree, though, to participate?

6 THE REPORTER: What was your question,  
7 Mark?

8 MR. CERRETA: Do they have to agree to  
9 participate?

10 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

11 MR. REVOLDT: I do not believe they do.

12 MR. CERRETA: Then that changes. All  
13 right. Because I found the same thing that  
14 Chuck mentioned about those two -- those two  
15 businesses down there.
