1 MAYOR WILDER: This is Mayor Steve Wilder
2 calling to order at 10:01 this morning on
3 Friday, June 23, 2023 the Board of Control,
4 the City of North Canton.

5 Ms. Cross, will you please make the roll
6 call?

7 MS. CROSS: Yes, sir. Stephan Wilder.

8 MAYOR WILDER: Here.

9 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

10 MR. DEORIO: Here.

11 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

12 MS. ALABACK: Here.

13 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

14 MR. BOYER: Here.

15 MS. CROSS: And also joining us is Chief
16 Frank Kemp, the North Canton Police
17 Department.

18 MAYOR WILDER: Very good. We have a
19 quorum. We can go forward.

20 Item 3 on our agenda is the approval of
21 the minutes from April 20, 2023 meeting. May
22 I have a motion to approve the minutes as
23 presented?

24 MS. ALABACK: So moved.

25 MAYOR WILDER: May I have a second?

1 MR. BOYER: Second.

2 MAYOR WILDER: Any debate -- it has been
3 seconded. Any debate or discussion on the
4 minutes?

5 (No response.)

6 MAYOR WILDER: If not, all in favor, say
7 "aye."

8 MR. DEORIO: Aye.

9 MAYOR WILDER: Aye.

10 MR. BOYER: Aye.

11 MS. ALABACK: Aye.

12 MAYOR WILDER: Opposed?

13 (No response.)

14 MAYOR WILDER: Motion carries. The
15 minutes are approved from the April 20, 2023
16 meeting.

17 Item number 4, we are moving into new
18 business, and that involves the police
19 department is seeking Board of Control
20 approval for its purchases of two vehicles
21 and corresponding vehicle equipment and
22 modifications as accounted for in the 2023
23 fiscal budget. As I understand it, the
24 police vehicles with equipment and -- for a
25 total capital expenditure item cost cap of

1 \$130,000.

2 Are there any questions to come before
3 the Board? Or if Chief Kemp is present, if
4 there are any questions we have of Chief Kemp
5 for the two police vehicles and equipment,
6 I'll open the floor for discussion on that.

7 Do we have to get into the specific cost
8 of each vehicle, Wayne?

9 MR. BOYER: I would --

10 MAYOR WILDER: Item number 1 and 2.

11 MR. BOYER: I would mention the specific
12 cost, just saying that it is below the amount
13 that was approved. Reference the ordinance,
14 in giving the amount, and reference the fact
15 that this total amount is below that
16 ordinance, yes.

17 MAYOR WILDER: Okay.

18 MS. CROSS: Combined total cost of the
19 purchases is quoted at \$124,590.13, which is
20 less than the \$130,000 cost cap, the capital
21 expenditure item as a whole.

22 MAYOR WILDER: Right. That is allocated
23 to the corresponding capital expenditure Item
24 1K for Ordinance Number 09-2023. And
25 Ordinance 41-2023.

1 MR. BOYER: Okay. Chief Kemp, do you
2 have any comments related to this?

3 CHIEF KEMP: If you have no questions, I
4 believe it was pretty clear, and what
5 Ms. Cross presented to you, an explanation.

6 MAYOR WILDER: Okay. Question then; will
7 the motion be for the exact price or should
8 we make it it will be under the cap of
9 \$130,000?

10 MS. ALABACK: As long as it didn't exceed
11 the Board of Control amount in the
12 appropriations.

13 MS. CROSS: With the quotes given.

14 MAYOR WILDER: Can I entertain a motion
15 then to approve the purchase of two police
16 patrol vehicles with equipment, not to exceed
17 the capital expenditure item cost of
18 \$130,000? Will that be a sufficient motion?

19 MR. BOYER: I believe so. I'll make that
20 motion.

21 MAYOR WILDER: Okay. May I have a
22 second?

23 MS. ALABACK: Second.

24 MAYOR WILDER: Seconded by Ms. Alaback.
25 Therefore, before the Board for approval is

1 the purchase of two police patrol vehicles
2 with equipment for a total capital
3 expenditure item cost capping at \$130,000.
4 Roll call vote then for approval.

5 MS. CROSS: Yes, sir. Stephan Wilder.

6 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

7 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

8 MR. DEORIO: Yes.

9 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

10 MS. ALABACK: Yes.

11 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

12 MR. BOYER: Yes.

13 MAYOR WILDER: Very fine. Motion carries
14 for the purchase of two police patrol
15 vehicles with equipment.

16 Moving on to item 4B for the street
17 department discussion, presentation on the
18 vehicles and vehicle equipment purchase
19 approval. So before the Board of Control,
20 the street department is seeking final Board
21 of Control approval for its purchases of two
22 vehicles and corresponding vehicle equipment,
23 as accounted for in the 2023 fiscal budget.

24 Again, authorization to seek out the
25 contracts and quotes for these capital

1 expenditure items was granted via the
2 Ordinance 09-2023, 1Q. That was for two Ford
3 F250s with plows, which was given initial
4 approval by the Board of Control on January
5 2023. The combined total cost of vehicle one
6 and two on our information provided for
7 current approval is \$138,189.90, which is
8 less than the \$150,000 allocated to the
9 corresponding capital expenditure, item 1Q in
10 Ordinance 09-2023.

11 One vehicle is an F250 with plow and
12 light bar. Appears to be \$77,093.95 total.
13 The second vehicle, which is a Ford F250 with
14 plow and light bar, submitted cost is
15 \$61,095.95. Again, totaling \$138,189.90.

16 Any discussion from the Board on the
17 purchase of two vehicles for the street
18 department?

19 MR. DEORIO: I would support a motion not
20 to exceed \$140,000.

21 MR. BOYER: It's \$150-.

22 MR. DEORIO: Where's 150-?

23 MS. ALABACK: Board of Control amount was
24 \$150-.

25 MR. DEORIO: That was how much was

1 allocated, but I don't want to allocate
2 \$150-.

3 MS. ALABACK: We are not. But that's
4 what the Board of Control not-to-exceed
5 amount was. We are saying these did come
6 under the Board of Control amount --

7 MR. DEORIO: I thought we didn't do these
8 before, because of the issues --

9 MS. ALABACK: They are all on the list.

10 MR. DEORIO: We didn't approve every --

11 MS. CROSS: We gave initial approval.
12 That's why we are coming back now with the
13 exact quotes and purchase agreements,
14 contracts, et cetera, to have the exact
15 amount approved, that is under that Board of
16 Control capital expenditure item cost cap of
17 \$150,000. It does fall under the -- that
18 cost cap.

19 MR. DEORIO: But if we approve it at the
20 cost cap, does that also allow for the
21 additional \$11,000 to be spent? Where is the
22 control over these quotes?

23 MS. ALABACK: We are approving
24 \$138,189.90 for total cost, which is under
25 the \$150- that was originally allocated.

1 MR. DEORIO: So what is the motion then?

2 MAYOR WILDER: The motion would be to
3 approve the purchase of two Ford F250s with
4 plows, which is with a corresponding capital
5 expenditure of no more than \$150,000.

6 MR. BOYER: I think I understand what
7 Mr. DeOrio is saying. I would request that
8 we reword the motion to say that I would move
9 that we approve the cost of the two Ford
10 F250s with plow and light bar for the total
11 amount of \$138,189.90, which does not exceed
12 the \$150,000 cost cap that was allocated to
13 this capital expenditure pursuant to item 1Q
14 in Ordinance 09-2023.

15 MR. DEORIO: I'll second that.

16 MAYOR WILDER: Without repeating that
17 motion, and understanding it, any further --
18 it has been seconded. Any other discussion
19 or debate on the purchase of the two
20 vehicles?

21 (No response.)

22 MAYOR WILDER: If not, Ms. Cross, will
23 you call for a roll call vote?

24 MS. CROSS: Yes, sir. Stephan Wilder.

25 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

1 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

2 MR. DEORIO: Yes.

3 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

4 MS. ALABACK: Yes.

5 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

6 MR. BOYER: Yes.

7 MAYOR WILDER: Motion carries for the
8 purchase of two Ford F250s with plows for the
9 street department.

10 Item 4C is for the parks. They are also
11 seeking vehicle and vehicle equipment for
12 purchase and approval. So before the Board
13 of Control for consideration, the parks
14 department is seeking final Board of Control
15 approval for its purchases of four vehicles
16 and corresponding vehicle equipment as
17 accounted for in the 2023 fiscal budget.

18 Two vehicles are dedicated for use by the
19 parks department. One vehicle is dedicated
20 by -- for use by the building staff. And one
21 vehicle is dedicated for the use by the
22 traffic and electric staff.

23 Now, the contracts and quotes for these
24 capital expenditure items were granted by
25 North Canton Ordinance 09-2023. That was

1 Section 1E. That is for the pickup truck
2 with plow attachment for the building
3 department. And Section 1M accounts for two
4 pickup trucks with plows for the parks
5 department. And Section 1R, transit,
6 full-size cargo work van, which was given
7 initial approval by the Board of Control on
8 the January 2023 meeting.

9 So attached before us is the breakdown of
10 the four vehicles for capital expenditure
11 items, and that is summarized for us.

12 With legal advice, do we vote on each
13 vehicle individually or can we --

14 MR. BOYER: My preference I think here
15 would be to vote on it per ordinance section
16 approval. So we vote on --

17 MAYOR WILDER: Okay.

18 MR. BOYER: -- vehicles one and two with
19 one motion, vehicle three with one motion,
20 and vehicle four with one motion.

21 MAYOR WILDER: Okay. Thank you for that
22 advice. So for vehicle one and two --
23 vehicle one is a Ford F250 with a plow
24 package, totalling cost -- with equipment, of
25 course, \$60,706.26. Their second vehicle is

1 a Ford F250 with plow package/equipment,
2 totalling \$61,195.02. Both of these vehicles
3 come under Section --

4 MS. CROSS: 1M.

5 MAYOR WILDER -- 1M.

6 MR. BOYER: I'll make a motion that we
7 approve the purchase of two vehicles, two
8 Ford F250s with plow packages, for the total
9 amount of \$121,901.28, which is below the
10 total cost allocated at \$150,000 to this
11 capital expenditure, pursuant to Item 1M in
12 Ordinance 09-2023.

13 MR. DEORIO: Second.

14 MAYOR WILDER: Second by Mr. DeOrio. Any
15 further debate or question on those -- on
16 that motion?

17 (No response.)

18 MAYOR WILDER: If not, we'll do a roll
19 call vote, please, for approval.

20 MS. CROSS: Yes, sir. Stephan Wilder.

21 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

22 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

23 MR. DEORIO: Yes.

24 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

25 MS. ALABACK: Yes.

1 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

2 MR. BOYER: Yes.

3 MAYOR WILDER: The yeses have it. The
4 motion carries for the purchase of those two
5 vehicles.

6 The total cost for vehicle three, which
7 is a Ford transit vehicle, is \$49,914. The
8 total cost of that vehicle would -- is less
9 than the \$55,000 allocated to the
10 corresponding capital expenditure Item 1R in
11 Ordinance 09-23.

12 Could I have a motion to -- did I just
13 make the motion? Sorry. Do we have a motion
14 to go forward with the purchase of vehicle
15 number three?

16 MR. DEORIO: So moved.

17 MAYOR WILDER: May I have a second?

18 MR. BOYER: I'll second.

19 MAYOR WILDER: Motion has been seconded
20 for vehicle number three, which is a Ford
21 transit, for the approval amount of \$49,914,
22 which is less than the \$55,000 allocated to
23 the corresponding capital expenditure Item 1R
24 in Ordinance 09-23. Thank you.

25 For the fourth vehicle --

1 MS. CROSS: Do a roll call.

2 MAYOR WILDER: Yes. I'm sorry.

3 MS. CROSS: Stephan Wilder.

4 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

5 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

6 MR. DEORIO: Yes.

7 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

8 MS. ALABACK: Yes.

9 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

10 MR. BOYER: Yes.

11 MAYOR WILDER: Thank you. I was trying
12 to summarize the motion. I forgot. Got
13 ahead of myself.

14 On item number 4, this is a Ford F250
15 with plow package. The cost being
16 \$61,847.14. I'll make the motion to go
17 forward with approval for that, which is less
18 than the \$75,000 allocated to the
19 corresponding capital expenditure item of 1E
20 in Ordinance 09-2023.

21 MR. BOYER: I'll second.

22 MAYOR WILDER: Seconded by Mr. Boyer.

23 Any other debate or discussion on that item?

24 (No response.)

25 MAYOR WILDER: If not, we'll call for a

1 roll call vote.

2 MS. CROSS: Yes, sir.

3 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

4 MS. CROSS: Stephan Wilder.

5 MAYOR WILDER: Yes.

6 MS. CROSS: Patrick DeOrio.

7 MR. DEORIO: Yes.

8 MS. CROSS: Jina Alaback.

9 MS. ALABACK: Yes.

10 MS. CROSS: Wayne Boyer.

11 MR. BOYER: Yes.

12 MAYOR WILDER: Very fine. Motion carries
13 for the purchase of that vehicle for the park
14 department.

15 Not seeing any other business come before
16 the Board, can I have a motion to adjourn?

17 MR. DEORIO: So moved.

18 MAYOR WILDER: So moved by Mr. DeOrio.

19 MS. ALABACK: Second.

20 MAYOR WILDER: Seconded by Ms. Alaback.

21 All in favor, say "aye."

22 MR. DEORIO: Aye.

23 MAYOR WILDER: Aye.

24 MS. ALABACK: Aye.

25 MR. BOYER: Aye.
