6 MR. CERRETA: I'll be glad to this morning.

7 Lord, thank you for bringing us here this
8 wonderful morning. Thank you for this wonderful
9 responsibility of giving us for this wonderful
10 community. Look down and protect us all from evil
11 throughout the world. Help us to move forward in the
12 way you would will us to be. We ask that you make us
13 listen with our wonderful ears and say the right
14 things and what you would want to say. And help us
15 to look forward to making this community exactly what
16 you would like it to be in the future.

17 In God's name, we pray. Amen.

18 MR. PETERS: Thank you, Mark.

19 All right. At this time, if you would join
20 me in the Pledge of Allegiance.

21 (Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

22 MR. PETERS: All right. Clerk, would you
23 please call the roll.

24 MR. YOUNG: Member Werren?

25 MRS. WERREN: Here.

1 MR. YOUNG: Member Foltz?

2 MR. FOLTZ: Here.

3 MR. YOUNG: Member Stroia?

4 MR. STROIA: Here.

5 MR. YOUNG: Member Revoldt?

6 MR. REVOLDT: Here.

7 MR. YOUNG: Member Cerreta?

8 MR. CERRETA: Here.

9 MR. YOUNG: Member Fonte?

10 MR. FONTE: Here.

11 MR. YOUNG: And President Peters?

12 MR. PETERS: Here.

13 MR. YOUNG: Seven present.

14 MR. PETERS: Outstanding. Okay.

15 Moving on to new business, may I have a
16 motion and a second to read by title only Ordinance
17 37-20.

18 MR. FOLTZ: Move by Foltz.

19 MR. REVOLDT: Second by Revoldt.

20 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

21 ("Aye" in unison.)

22 MR. PETERS: Opposed? All right. Motion
23 carries.

24 Tim.

25 MR. FOX: An ordinance authorizing the mayor,

1 upon board of control approval, to enter into a
2 contract with Omnipro Services, LLC, for construction
3 management, construction inspection service for the
4 federally funded East Maple enhancement project, "the
5 project," at a cost not to exceed \$185,000 and
6 declaring the same to be an emergency.

7 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you.

8 Chairman Fonte.

9 MR. FONTE: Yes. We talked about this the
10 other day and the week before. Basically we have
11 this \$2 million project there on Maple, East Maple,
12 and since it's federal funds, they require, like,
13 everything to the penny. You know, every washer,
14 bolt, nut, every accounting of everything making sure
15 we follow and conform to all the rules, and we have
16 Omnipro as our service provider to be able to do
17 that. And the cost is not to exceed 185K.

18 It's a \$2 million project. We've done things
19 ourselves on the small projects, this is a big one,
20 and I think we talked about it quite a bit, Patrick
21 and Rob covered everything. If you have anything
22 else you want to chime in. It's on an emergency
23 because time is of the essence. We want to get this
24 project rolling, hopefully this year, July, August, I
25 can't remember when they're going to start it. If

1 anybody wants to start chime in, I say we move
2 forward with this and get it rolling quickly.

3 MRS. WERREN: I think we had the discussion
4 the other night. Let's go.

5 MR. FONTE: Okay. Let's get it on, pass it
6 on an emergency.

7 MR. PETERS: All right. Can I have a motion
8 and a second to adopt the first reading?

9 MRS. WERREN: So moved, Werren.

10 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta. Second.

11 MR. FOLTZ: Second. Foltz.

12 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

13 ("Aye" in unison.)

14 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

15 May I have a motion and a second to suspend
16 the rules of council requiring three readings.

17 MR. FOLTZ: So moved. Foltz.

18 MRS. WERREN: Werren. Second.

12 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

14 MR. FOX: An ordinance authorizing amending
15 the appropriation of funds of the City of North
16 Canton for current expenses during the fiscal year
17 ending December 31, 2020, as established by Ordinance
18 80-2019, to account for new revenue and declaring the
19 the same to be an emergency.

20 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you.

21 Chairwoman Werren.

22 MRS. WERREN: Okay. We talked about this the
23 other day and finance director Jina gave us a good
24 update. And so this is a (inaudible) costs on a
25 property that we bought. Any other questions?

1 MR. PETERS: Amen.

2 MRS. WERREN: All right. I moved to adopt.

3 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz. Second.

4 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

5 ("Aye" in unison.)

6 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

7 May I have a motion and a second to suspend

8 the rules of council requiring three meetings?

9 MRS. WERREN: So moved. Werren.

10 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta. Second.

11 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

12 ("Aye" in unison.)

13 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

14 And finally, a motion and a second to adopt

15 Ordinance 38-20 under suspension.

16 MRS. WERREN: So moved. Werren.

25 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

2 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

4 MR. FOX: An ordinance authorizing the mayor,
5 upon board of control approval, to enter into a
6 contract with opengov.com, Inc., for digital
7 budgeting software as a service at a cost not to
8 exceed \$170,000, and declaring the same to be an
9 emergency.

10 MR. PETERS: Thank you, Tim.

11 Chairwoman Werren.

12 MRS. WERREN: Okay. Again, on Monday night
13 we had a really good discussion on this. We moved it
14 up to 170,000, and it's for new equipment that
15 hopefully will help for our digital budgeting
16 software, and I think we made that note in there as
17 well that, as Daryl pointed out, it's a subscription,
18 not something that we will hold on our laptops for an
19 entirety. Jina thinks that's going to be really
20 helpful and kind of we're one of the front ones to be
21 using it. I move to adopt if no other questions.

22 MR. FONTE: It's a five-year contract;
23 correct?

24 MR. PETERS: Yes.

25 MRS. WERREN: Yes.

1 MR. FONTE: Okay. That's all I need to know.

2 MR. PETERS: All right. We have a motion.

3 Is there a second?

4 MR. STROIA: Second. Stroia.

5 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

6 ("Aye" in unison.)

7 MR. PETERS: Opposed? Motion carries.

8 May I have a motion and a second to suspend
9 the rules of council requiring three readings.

10 MRS. WERREN: So moved. Werren.

11 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta. Second.
