Ordinance No. 37 - 2019

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of North Canton, upon Board of Control approval, and pursuant to the Ohio Cooperative Purchase Act, to enter into a purchase agreement for a 2020 Mack Granite 42BR dump truck together with a snow and ice control package, to replace a 2003 model, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City must replace a 2003 dump truck to maintain City streets, parks, sewers, snow removal, etc.; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Cooperative Purchase Act enables municipalities, such as the City of North Canton, to benefit from economies of scale, expedite its procurement process, and achieve a substantial purchase savings for the purchase of the truck.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of North Canton, upon Board of Control approval, and pursuant to the Ohio Cooperative Purchase Act, be, and is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement to purchase a 2020 Mack Granite 42BR dump truck together with a snow and ice control package, to replace a 2003 model, at a cost not to exceed \$190,000.00.

Section 2. That the Director of Finance of the City of North Canton, be, and is hereby authorized to draw funds necessary for the payment of the above-specified contract from the following appropriations:



upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.

Section 3. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, that shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.

Section 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and peace of the City and further necessary to maintain City streets, parks, sewers, snow removal, etc., and replace a 2003 model; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of six or more members of Council elected thereto, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
